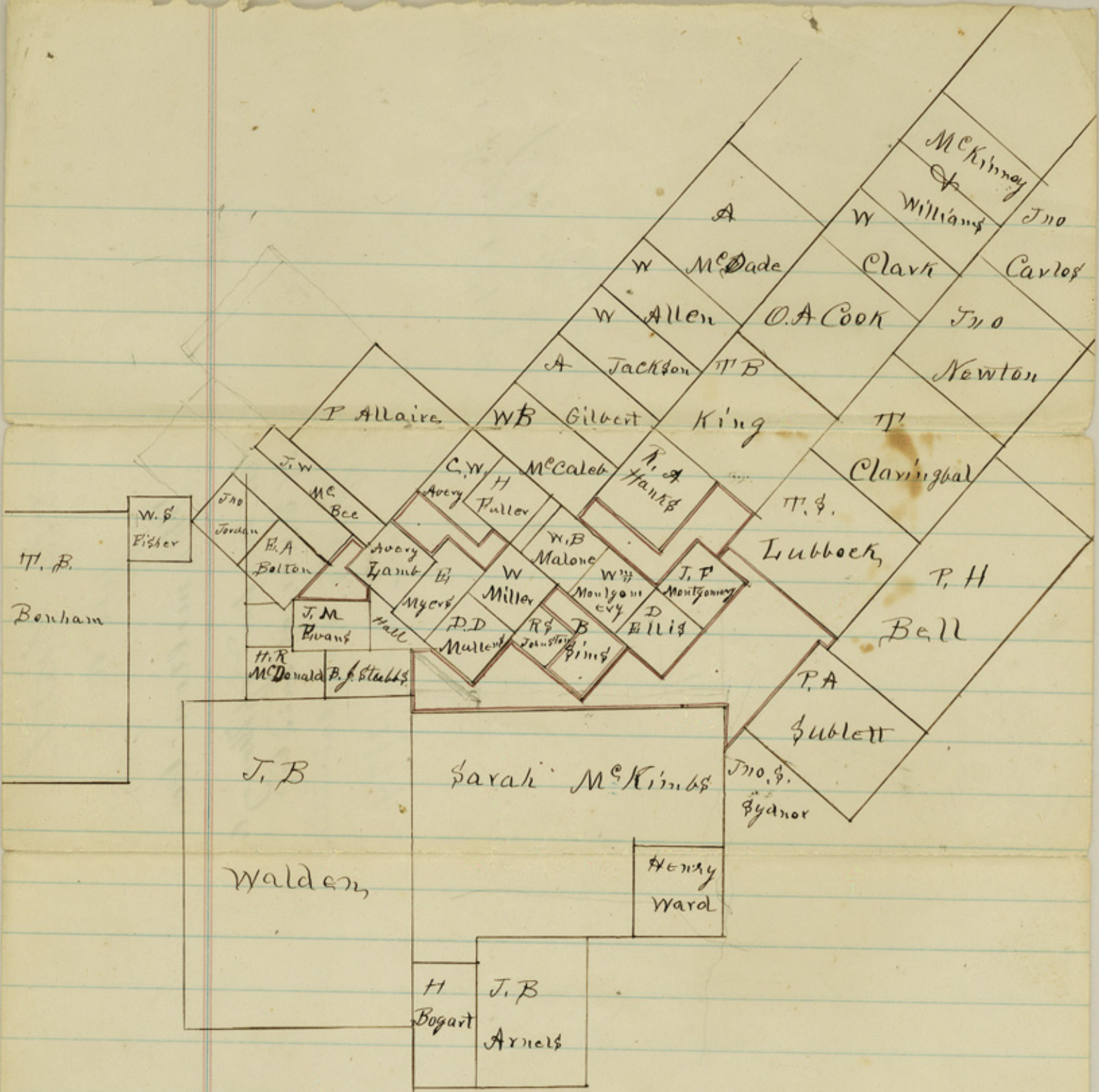

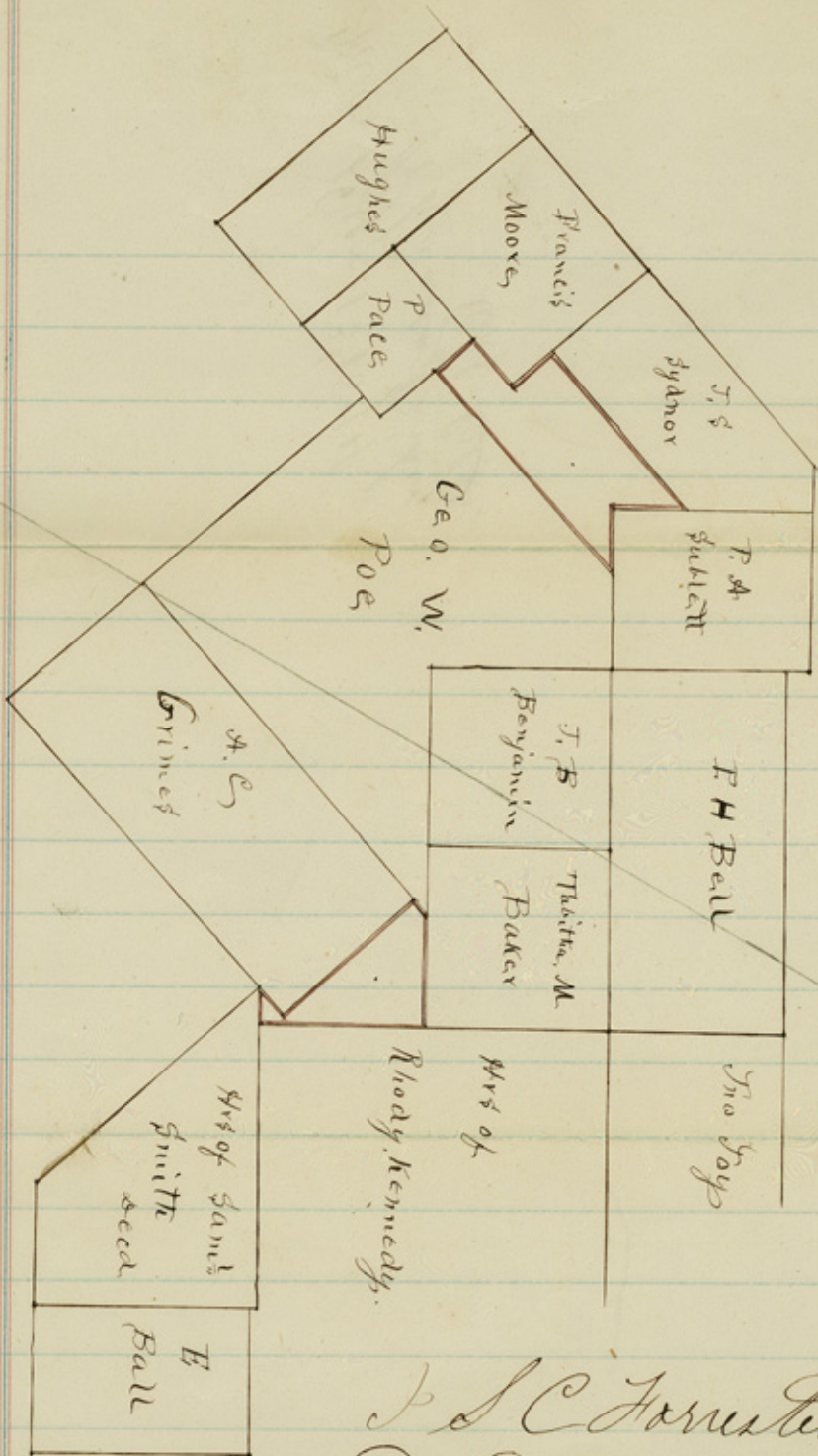

I S. B. Forrester do hereby certify that I did with compass & chain go upon the ground and began at the S. E. Cor. of Henry Ward's upper Sur. with its bearing trees as called. now standing. I ran thence N. 19. E. 1344. vrs. to Henry Ward's N. E. Cor. on W. brow. of a hill crossing a creek at the distance called for by the John S. Sidnor field notes; continued passing John S. Sidnor's Cor. a pile of concrete rocks near a concrete point, continued in all. 3372. vrs. found the N. E. Cor. of the Sarah McKimbs Sur. a pile of concrete rocks in a flat place, near the head of a hollow. prong of the branch called for by Sidnor & Ward field notes. I then made connection with the J. F. Montgomery S. W. Cor which bears N. 19. E. 1550. vrs and S 60. W 466. ²/₅ vrs from the N. E. Cor. of said Sarah McKimbs. The Montgomery & Ellis Corners an up. plainly marked, known & recognized. The connection on this Block of pre-emption Surveys. was well & accurately made and was good work originally: all the Surveys run by Geo. P. Erath, at an early day, over-run generally 181. vrs. to the mile as far as I have followed him. This Survey will not close by some considerable distance with the table, but the connection was closely made both North & South, and East & West. The

Corners of the old Surveys are easily identified.

The II line of the M Knibbs does not conflict with anything whatever on the ground. in fact the whole Survey fits the old corners from accurate measurement made by myself, when correcting the Survey and subsequent work on it's line. The Balance of the Surveys are as they are represented on the certified sketch. The old Surveys are mixed timber & prairie and the error in closing the Sam Hickey Open Jose. Montes is slight. in closing up new with old work, and does not affect any interest on the ground

I L. C. F. J. do hereby certify that I did
with Compass & Chain go upon the
ground & began at the McAmphell
SW Corner on a small Past Oak tree
marked M in a cluster of Past Oaks
in a large valley Shimney. I ran
thence S 19 W 1750 ns (edging the
brow of the Mountain all the way)
& N 71 W 72 ns put up a pile of Stone
on N side of a small water run
for the beginning corner of a file
made by Geo. Potts by virtue
of same scrip.

Thence I ran S 19 W 1250 ns
through Shimney Past Oak to open
ground on the Mountain & across
pile on the West brow of the
Mountain for SE Corner of said
Potts file. I then connected
A Same State & Rail Road
Sections run from Brown
Co on Browns Creek Point
S 19 W 4324 ns & S 4 15 ns
the NW Corner of H. T. & B. R. R. Co
Sec No 27 & SW Cor of State Sec
No 28. I then ran S 17 00
ns the NW Cor of State Sec 26 from
which a Past Oak marked X ns S 39 ns
& another S 32 1/2 W 35 ns Thence I ran

Co 1900 is a stone mound on N side
of Grand mountain at its base on
the slope. Thence I ran S & found
the Brown Co line for the first time
at 1549 us said line being on three
live oaks & on the E prong of a double
live oak about 7¹/₂ in diameter.

Continued 1900 us to the beginning
corner of Moore's survey. I found
the line of Brown & Hamilton as
plainly marked as far as I traced
& call for it in my field notes.

The G. & H. Co conflict with
State Section 32, but will have
the changed to fit its lines.

The Comanche Co line is
as represented in the sketch &
corners in a cave place on N
side of the mountain near a small
round mountain.

I also certify that the sketch
shows from actual connection
the true position of the survey & that
there is no conflict whatever on
the ground with any survey.
