N.E. Corner, East, and West boundary line of the
Maru Jimenes League of land that we exam-
ined at the point and in the vicinity designated
by said Surveyor for the N.E. Corner of said
League and could find no marks or traces of the
said corner as mentioned and designated by
said Surveyor that this examination was made
at the request of said Surveyor, that we then
ran N. to a point 3090 varas designated by
the said Surveyor, at which point neither
in the vicinity thereof upon examination could
we find any stream of water whatever had we
continued this line the distance the surveyor
said it would require to reach the supposed N.E.
corner of said League and found any stream of
water it would flow from the nature of the ground
out, into Little Pine Island Bayou as no stream
from the face of the country could possibly enter
into Big Alabama Creek
