Some time ago I wrote the Land Office to try and get a correct estimate of the lands owned by the San Jacinto Battleground, thinking that they would have a true record of all lands purchased or deeded to the State. I have just received a letter from them and also yourself. As you probably know, I have been carrying these lands on my inventory as approximate only, as I have never had a true survey. Therefore I am going to give you all the information that I have and send the Lan d Office a copy as this is the only way that I have of giving this information.

I have been carrying this on my inventory as approximately 460 acres, which does not miss the mark so very much, but an analysis as I have had it told to me will no doubt fall short of this figure.

1927, Col. A. J. Houston told me that he had just had a survey of the then fenced Battleground that there was 35 acres on the west side of the County highway and 317 acres on the east side, total
