Dear Sir:

I enclose herewith
Field Notes of the survey connecting corners of
the J. C. Schule and the Pagsdale Surveys with
corner of Block 1, I & G N; etc.

It was not possible to chain with accuracy
across the break from the River to Red Deer
Creek. I therefore ran down the River to Red
Deer and up Red Deer, and in order to
have a check on the work I ran out to Home
Ranch Creek, down Home Ranch and across
to the beginning corner, making connections
with the corners called for in the Field Notes.
I think you can depend on these notes. I
staid with the chain carriers when the ground
was rough and helped level up the chain on
slopes. About three-fourths of the survey was
chained twice. I detected some errors in the
count and went over the ground till I found
them. The survey balance within 45 rods of

latitude and 41 varas departure, which I think is very good for a 40 mile run.

I also send you the sketch you sent to Mr. Isaacs and a sketch I made myself, giving my understanding of the shape and size of the resurveyed sections and the two scrap surveys, for the purpose of having them corrected if I am wrong. You can correct in red ink on this sketch and return to me.

Balancing the survey by pro rata additions ^{and} ^{deductions} of the latitude and departure, I make the difference in latitude between N E of Schule and N E of 83 Block B1 to be 14523 varas and the difference in departure to be 236 varas. The distances given in pencil on the sketch are figured on this basis. The sketch is not true to scale, but will answer for a diagram.

Survey 209 presents some difficulties, owing to a probable excess in 210 if it is closed down to the B&B Survey.

I will state that the connection shown on my sketch between the N E corner of Block 1
counter 26276

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and the N W corner of Survey 52, Block 41, is accurate. The N W of 52 is marked with a stone mound and a trailing tree, and I made the connection a short time ago. This may help in figuring on Surveys 226 and 227.

I hope you can ^{get} action on this work by Mr. Hammett at an early day.
