Dear Sir!

To verify the vacancy covered by surveys Nos 499, 500 & 501, I hereby submit the following statement of the corners found and connections made, to wit: Due West of the "Candelaria" lake, and Mot (the Mot being visible) "I find a stone, which is the N. W. corner of the "Alazan" survey. Thence run West 12335,5 varas to a point due South of the "Santa Quitaria" N. W. corner and connect North 567 varas to the post (Mesquite) found by running  $S 15^{\circ} 30' E$  4771 varas as per call from the "Guerritas" mot. The "Alazan" survey begins on a permanent and unchangeable corner 71 varas North of the "Candelaria" lake. The "Quitaria" survey begins on the N. W. corner and makes as call for the "Alazan" survey. Consequently the vacancy of the width of 567 varas exists without doubt and the official map is wrong in that it shows the two surveys "Santa Quitaria" and "Alazan" on the same line East and West.
