Replying to your favor of the 8th inst, where-in you say, that there are no field-notes for certain sections in Blocks 66 1/2--72--73-& 75. and none at all for Blk. 102. as per my map of the survey of the Public Lands in El Paso County, made for the School Fund,

It was my intention to try to make the proper connections on the ground with the river surveys, but I was called in from the field before I got to it. It was a mistake to number these sections on the map, I did not wish to give a certificate and field notes for those sections from calculation only. As Block 102 contained less than 2500 acres it was left out.

Dear Sir,

I am enclosing copy of letter which I have written to you & will

that it is not possible to get such a certificate from the
Ministry of Justice as they do not issue certificates of ownership.
It is my opinion that the best course of action is to
get a certificate of ownership from the appropriate
authority in your country.
