To SIX HUNDRED AND FORTY ACRES OF LAND, to be located upon any of the vacant, unreserved and unappropriated public domain of the State of Texas, information having been received that said Railway Company has completed a section of Seventy-four Miles and Three Hundred and Thirty Feet of its road, in accordance with its Charter and the General Laws regulating Railroads.

The Lands granted to said Company are to be located in alternate sections and surveyed in the following manner:

- 1.—Two sections of land adjoining and connecting with each other must be surveyed, one for the State and the other for the Company.
- 2.—The surveys to be made square, unless prevented by previous entries or navigable streams.
- 3.—The Commissioner will select and number the surveys and report the result to the Surveyor, who will fill up the blanks left in his record for that purpose, accordingly. (As a matter of convenience in describing the surveys, when reporting the numbers the Surveyor should number the field-notes temporarily in pencil.)
- 4.—In dividing the surveys, a fraction of over three hundred and twenty acres will be counted as a whole section, and two fractions of less than three hundred and twenty acres will be regarded as a section.
- 5.—The even numbers will be reserved to the State, and the odd numbers to the Company.
