to send a small amount of information to the
Genl. Land Office. A few days ago I had
occasion to run a line East from W^m
Carr's N.E. Corner across G. Hillebrand's league
and found the distance from Carr's N.E.
Corner to Hillebrand's Bayou (West bank) to
be 1387 1/2 varas, the Bayou is 30 varas wide.
Also ran from Hillebrand's N.W. Corner East
on Hillebrand's north line
and found the distance from Hillebrand's N.W. Cor.
to Hillebrand's Bayou to be 1350 varas, (West bank)
Bayou 20 varas wide.
