

Goliad 12th October 1851

George W. Smith Esq;

Sir; Herewith I send to you a plot
of my surveys upon the Colorado & San Antonio rivers, —
you will perceive that there is a great error upon
the Old Map in the Colorado Surveys. — I ran the line
between Bexar & Goliad Districts from the mouth of
the Cibolo to the road from Victoria to San Antonio
via the Sulphur Spring, where I connected it with
the corner of a Survey, said to have been made
for — Deumman in the Bexar District,
(viz; from Deumann's corner North 1122 Varas. West 326
varas to the County line at the road.) —

I have plotted out the meanders of the San Antonio
as far as I have ascertained them from my
surveys, from the Ojo upward. — The black
lines on the plot, show the surveys that I have
made & upon which I have put the river &
creeks as I found them — the faint, or
interrupted lines, are marked from the old
map — I have not surveyed upon them &
cannot bank for their correctness, except
2 or 3 corners marked by a small circle which
I have determined. — From J. Murphy; S.W.
corner S. 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ E. 1055 Varas is the West angle of
Dr. Witt County — In regard to the conflicting
surveys, Hardsaway appears to have the oldest date
Begins at its N.W. corner, E. 590 ft. Colorado 800 Thicket,
1160 dry branch & Live Oak Mr. H.M. — this appears to
me to be identical with the N. line of a Survey
I made for Taita — on which is a Live Oak by
a dry branch (since determined to be the Mustang branch)
marked H.M. then W. 270 thro' a thicket, 618 to Colorado
Hawks — (5th March 1838) begins on S.W. of Hardsaway
Pickett (6th March 1838) begins at Hawks' N.W.
corner (3rd March 1838) begins at Hawks N.W. &

I have marked the surveys on tracing paper
& laid it over so as to bring the Live Oak, dry branch
& thicket of Hardsaway, — upon the Live Oak, dry branch
& thicket of Taita.

I should be pleased if you would send
me a plot of the Bexar Survey, that lay upon
the dividing line I have run, & that come over into this
District, & mark those that have been patented;
also please inform which of the Goliad surveys upon
the same line (if any) are patented, & which (if any)
of the conflicting ones on the Colorado have been patented


I would further request of you to send me a
