Captain Louis Corrold, Sir. With due and proper submission, I, Carlos Martinez, a native of the town of San Fernando, Royal Presidio of San Antonio de Bexar, and an inhabitant for fourteen months of this Royal Presidio of Le Bahia dol Espiritu Santo, most humbly and respectfully represent to you, that I am a son of one of the ancient settlers of the before mentioned Presidio of Bexar, and have been in the service of his Majesty the King (whom God preserve) for sixteen years at his royal Military posts, such as the Royal Presidio of Le Bahia -

That I have served twelve years during the time Captain Manuel de la Posona commanded and two years during the term of Captain Francisco Thever under whom I enlisted.

Of the many battles which during that time we had with Indians, I will morely call your attention to two, in one of which we brought in one hundred and fifty warriers (borados) the Commander of our detachment being Augustin de Cosme and an - other in which we took a large number of horses leaded with meat, the Commander of our detachment then being Ensign Bernabe Caravejal; emitting the mention of various skirmishes and pursuits which did not amount to battles.

I also beg loave to submit to your consideration that two of my brothers, lost their lives by the hands of the enemy; as well as that the blood of my encestors, has been continually shed, on this frontior, and in like manner would it have happoned, in the defence of the Presidio of Boxar, when the Gerrison would have perished had it not been that my deceased father, through devine providence, killed the Indian Chief of the Apaches, the tribe which attached the said Presidio of Boxar, and which act was sufficient to cause the enemy to retreat.

And in as much as it is the benign and charitable purpose of our sovereign, as appears by his royal decroes, wherein he most solemnly charges that the first conquerors and actual settlers of the frontiers of his dominions should be attended to and favored in preference to all others:

I have concluded to petition and pray, that you may do me the favor, to give me possession of Hight leepuss of land of the public domain, now vecant for the purpose of establishing a stock farm for raising cattle.

Beginning at the place where the land of Joschin de la Garze corner,

Thence with the River downward the distance of three leagues and extending back towards the Nuccess on a straight line, the distance of five leagues, and that you may at the time after these documents shall have been completed, order the proper copy of them to be given to me, in order to pay such fees as may be due to his Majesty in view of all which I proy you may be pleased to grant this my potition in the manner herein expressed, it being justice which I implore, and that you will admit this petition on the present common paper, there being no scaled paper, I make each in due form, that this is in good faith, with all other necessary protestations & C -

In the Royal Presidio de Le Bahia del Espiruto Santo this seventh day of the Month of June of the year one thousand seven hundred and eighty eight.

I, Don Luis Cezorla, Coptain of Cevalry of the above farrison, Military Commandant of the same and Governor and Chief Justice of the town and district; by the King our Lord (whom God preserve) in consideration of the petition presented by Carles Martinez, a native of the town of San Formando de Austria in the Presidio of Bexar, and now a resident of this place, under my command and in view of his respectability, food conduct and services, of which I am well informed. By virtue of the authority which his Mejesty has condescended to vest in me, in Chapter 1st, Section 11th of the Royal Regulations, and Instructions for the government of presidies, dated 10th December of the past year, one thousand seven hundred and seventy two. I grant to the before mentioned has Martinez the grant of Lond of the Royal Demain which he solicits in his petition, with all the obligations provided in the aforesaid regulations to Cultivate them and to have horses, arms and emmunition in readiness to go against the enemy, whenever necessity may require, and he may be ordered to be subject in all things to the authority to which he will recur in primary instances and in Like manner to the oulesiesteial tribunal within the jurisdiction of this Parish, ti being well understood, that said Grant is not to prejudice

any other jurisdiction, or the interests of adjoining perties, in any right they may have in case claim should be made until the point is decided by low: he the before mentioned Carlos Martinez being liable to service in his turn as a Municipal Officer in Common with others of this Presidio, as inhabitant of the same: under which conditions I grant and confirm the before mentioned grant of land at the places he designeted.

I will also do the same, when he shall apply for a town lot, in the said Presidio, upon which to build a house without injury to a third party; and in order that this my decree may serve the before mentioned Carlos Martinez for his security and logitimate title, I as in duty bound to order, do Command, that an authenticated copy of it be given to him, and that the original be placed in the Archives of this district under my Commande as governor of the same: that it may there appear at all times, in testimony whereof and by this my decree, thus did I adjudge and subscribe with my attendent witnesses, with whom I execute official cets in the absence of a Notary (there being none, either Royal or Public) in the manner prescribed by law, and on the present common papers, as sealed paper is not used in this province to all of which I certify.

The inhabitant of this province, Carlos Martinez, having sufficiently proven the injustice, with which you have endeavored to dispossess him of the Rancho named San Joso, which he has acquired by a legal title, I have placed upon the report, which for a qualification of his proceeding I ask of importial persons the following decree:

Valley of Santa Rosa May 27th, 1789

With respect to the Rencho, which it has been attempted to dispessors Carlos Martinez, is situated in the Jurisdiction of the Presidio do la Bahia del Espiritu Santo, the population of which is Military, and as the Rancho was acquired by that party lawfully, the proceedings taken by the Governor of Texas, in violation to this subject is unjust-

The Commandant of the Presidio de la Bahia del Expiritu Santo, will protect and maintain the aforesaid Martinez in the possession of the aforesaid Rancho, named San Jose, without the Governor of the Province, or any other person being permitted to disturb or dispossess him of it unless vanquished by a due course of law, in a proceeding presecuted by all the forecess of a Court of Justice, to his dispossession or expulsion; give orders that in said case only, and in no other, will this General Head Quarter Communicate with the aforesaid commandent of Captain of the Presidio de la Bahia del Espiritu Santo.

I transcribe it for your information that the suit is suspended which has been instituted without any reason against the said Martinez and to the end also, that in your proceedings you will take care to maintain Justice, and protect the unfortunate, when persons of power, or Landlords, attempt to oppress them, that they should have recourse to the remedy in their necessity - God guard you many years.

Plaintiffs also introduced Antonio Manchaca, who being duly sworn, testified as follows -

Witness was born in San Antonio de Bexar on the 12th day of January in the year 1800, and has lived in San Antonio all his life -

I first knew Carlos Martinoz whon I was about 8 years old -

Carlos Mortinoz was killed by the Indians in 1815;

Carlos Martinez lived at his ranch from the time I knew him first, until his doath; his Rancho was situnted. on the South side of the San Antonio River, near the Escondide Creek in what was then Bexar, new Karnes County. The Rancho in his judgment was situated about one & a half of 2 leegues from where Helena now is. I was at the Rancho in 1834; was sent down against the Tonkoway Indians -Carlos Martinez then lived there with his family -

The Escondido was then called Galbazes and sometimes Espantifors and Indian name; when I was a boy, I heard Carlos Martinez tell some old men, that he, Carlos Martinez had settled the Rancho in 1773. I heard all the old people say when I was a boy say it was a very old Rancho. It was a Rancho that always had plenty of horses, cattle, sheep & Hogs.

Witness knew all the Plaintiffs mentioned in the Petition. They were the children, grandchildren and greatgrandchildren of Carlos Martinez.

The houses and fances of Carlos Martinez were destroyed in 1843, by a company of white people who came to the Rancho from the Guadaloupe and Colorado Rivers, killed the people at the Ranche and stele their stock.

This Roncho of Carlos Martinez was called a frontior Rancho until of late years, and this predatory warfare continued until 1846 -

Some of the grand-children of Carlos Martinez married with Gallan, and some with Manchaea, and some with Justo Rodriquez, and Josopha Martinez, a great-granddaughter, married Francisco Jurez. These are all the descendants I know of Carlos Martinez.

Plaintiff then introduced a witness, R. A. Rutledge, who testified as follows:

My Father moved on the land in Controversy in the fall of 1851 and lived in a Camp, until the Spring of 1852, when he built a house on the land, about one mile above the mouth of the Escondido Creek -

In the Fall of 1852 my Father took a lease from R. H. Horde and acted as an agent for said Horde in protecting the timber on the land, and from trospasses -

My Fathor continued to act as agont for soid Horde until his doath in 1862 or 3.

There was a written agontoy from Horde.

Horde was the Ltty of the Plaintiffs in this suit.

My fathor lived upon the lend as the tenant and agent of Horde from the fell of 1857 until he died.

The Written Agentcy I speak of, cannot be found among my Father's papers.

My Father placed John Ricks on the land as a tenant of Plffs in 1852 and Ricks has so resided on the land up to the present time.

Horde was a Lawyor and the Atty of Martinoz, Cundiff wanted to lease the land to my Father, but Father would not accept a lease. Cundiff then threatened to throw our things out of the house when my Father showed him the written agentey from Horde and Cundiff respected the Agency.

Mr. Burnell Butler also respected the Agency given my Father by Horde.

Pleintiff then introduced A. D. Evans who was duly sworn and testified as follows:

Ho know Abraham Rutledge - He was my Father-in-law. I always understood Mr. Rutledge was Horde's agent, and that Horde was the attorney for representative of the Mortinez claim. Thinks there was a writing between Rutledge & Horde.

I have searched within the last few days emong my Father-in-Law's papers, and could not find the agoncy.

I first know Mr. Rutlodgo in 1859-

Plaintiff then introduced T. T. Teel, who being duly sworn, testified as follows:

I know Horde to be the sttornoy of the Martinez Heirs.

Plaintiff then introduced G. H. Nichols, who being duly sworn, tostified as follows:

I know Abraham Rutledge 8 or 10 years provious to his death; know he was the seent of the land in Controversy and went to him once to get a tree and he told me I could have one treep which I get.

L. S. Lawhon was introduced by Plaintiffs, and being duly sworn, testified as follows:

I know Robert H. Horde, he was a lowyer, and the Agent and Attornoy of the Plaintiffs.

He came to Karnes County, Texas, in 1857 or 8 on business connected with the land in Controversy.

Plaintiffs here closed their ovidence, and the Defendants offered none.

Aftor argument of Counsel, the Jury received the Charge of the Court and retired to consider of their verdict, and returning into Court rendered the following verdict, to-wit:

We, the Jury, find for the Plaintiffs, and that the Plaintiffs are the heirs and descendants of Carlos W. J. DEES, Foreman Martinez.

Wheroupon, it was Considered, ordered, adjudged and decreed by the Court, that the Plaintiffs do have and recover of and from the defendants, herein, the said land, to-wit: A certain tract of land traced on a plat on file in the Clerk's office and described in the following field notes -
