Dear Sir: In reply to your letter of May 26th regarding the West Cor . of the Ables Survey . say that in locating the point for this Cor it was necessary for me to retrace the West line of the Greer for a distance of about a half mile with was marked by by a two or more large P.O. trees with the hacks these trees have been preserved for more than fifty years by adjacent land owners and are standing in the center of a well traveled road . Retracing the South West line if the A .Ables line as recornized from a point about 60 .Ft S.45 & from the Cor follows a well marked line for more than 2000Ft . The intersection of these lines leades me to a point on the bank of a small branch from which the Cedar Stump bears as stated . With these evidences on the ground I am justified in concluding that I have located the proper Cor. Should the office wish further evidence I will try to supply same.

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Acknowledgment is made of your letter of May 23rd enclosing an affidavit of identification of the West corner of the A Ables survey #86 in Kaufman county, Texas.

According to this affidavit, you located this corner from one burnt stumm which you state can be easily identified as the original cedar bearing tree. There is some doubt in my mind as to whether you can identify a corner by a stump of a bearing tree unless that stump has the original identifying marks placed there by the surveyor. If you could have found both stumps and then retraced the line and found other evidence as well, it would have been much better. I shall file your affidavit for such information as it may give.

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During the month of May 1936 I have made a survey of the S.E.boundry of the A.Ables survey No 86 in Kaufman Co Texas at which time I was able to identify the West Cor or the beginning Cor of said survey as described in the original patent issued my the General Land Office May 29 1948. The two red oaks as described as bearing trees are gone however the point for the cor. on the bank of a small branch was located from the 302 cedar stump burnt to the level of the ground but easily identified as the original Cedar bearing tree. I re witnessed the point for the Cor as follows: A cedar stump 30" in Diam Brs S I8 W 30Vrs or 83.3ft an Elm I4" in Diam Brs S 63 W I0Vrs or 28 Ft an Elm I4" in Diam Brs N 80 Z 7.5Vrs or 21 Ft.

At this time I re ran the S.E.Boundry of said A.Ables Survey to a point near the East Cor of the Geo. Hider survey and find that the line as now called the North E line of said Survey is really 456 ft S 45 W of the S W line of the A Ables Sur and that the socalled the Weaver surve sur does not exists but is really a part of the Greer and Hider survey . and possibly apart of the Parsons Survey.

As a state Licensed Surveyor I make this affidavit from my surveys upon the ground and knowledge of other data obtained in the field leades me to these conslusons .
