Dear Sir:

In reply to your letter of March 13, 1922, in regard to cancellation of Patent of the Juana Delgardo Survey, Kaufman County, Texas, I shall say in the second paragraph of my report of February 25th, I stated that this Patent was cancelled by a decision of the Supreme Court of Texas rendered by Justice Moore in the case of Kleiber vs. Waters & Dashiell. The basis of my report was information given me by Judge J. S. Woods, who was an attorney for the Defendants in the above styled cause. Since receiving your letter, I find that the style of this case is Kleiber vs. Chas. B. Gillespie et al, in the District Court of Kaufman County, in 1887, and the Judgment is recorded in the Minutes of said Court in Vol. 9, page 265. The docket does not show that the case was appealed.

The subject matter of the case is as follows: Emile Kkeiber held title to 475 acres of land comprising the Delgardo Survey, under title from Waters & Dashiell, the Patentees. Gillespie et al. held title to the same land on the ground of title from the Patentees of the Ruth Peckum Survey, the Judgment of the Court giving the land in question to the Defendants.

Judge Woods advises me that the Court and the attorneys followed the decision in the case of Jones vs. Burkett, 46th Texas, 284 - that is that the King's blocks join up and that there are no vacancies existing between them.

There is no land on the Tax Assessor's books rendered in the Delgardo survey in this County, but the 475 acres sued for by Kleiber in the above suit is rendered on the Ruth Peckum Survey.

If you care for a certified copy of the Judgment of the Court setting aside this Patent, I will get the Clerk to furnish same.

Dear Sir;

The following is my report on the enclosed application and a survey upon the ground and an investigation of the records:

I find that upon the ground the North Corner of the Lewis Pearce and the South corner of the David Harris surveys are identical and that by the record the East corner of the J.B.White survey is 60 varas North 45 deg. West from this corner. The Wesley Boles survey of 23 acres, surveyed by Tinnin, August, 1968, between the Pearce and White, actually containing 9 acres, could not be identified on the ground. The identity of the North corner of the Pearce and the South corner of the Harris closes the apparent vacancy along the Southwest line of the Harris.

The Juana Delgardo survey located by Brewer, 1874, was patented to Waters and Dashiels and annulled by the Supreme Court of Texas in a decision by Justice Moore in the case of <u>Kleiber Vs. Waters and Dashiels</u>. The Court in the above case followed the decision in the Jones Vs. Burkett case, 46th, Texas, page 284. This decision closes the Southwest line of the Ruth Peckum Survey, upon the Northeast line of the Juan Lopez. The David Hines survey, located May, 1874, by Kyser, partly on the apparent vacancy Southeast of the Delgardo, has been cancelled;

Therefore, by the facts on the ground and the decisions of the courts in suits in trespass to try title to the apparent vacant stip of land along the Southwest lines of the David Harris and Ruth Peckum survey, Kaufman County, Texas, no vacancy exists where this applicant has applied.
