I--Katy Ingenhuett wish to make the fellowing statement regarding survey 1570, which surveyor Frank Newlin, is supposed to have run out on the ground in the year 1909 in order to correct the field note of this survey.

Mr. Nowlin states that he ran this corrected survey on the ground.

In 1909 travel and communications being of a primitive mode, Mr. Nowlin would have found it necessary to come to the Ranch from Boerne either on horseback or by horsedrawn vehicle; the trip being about 15 miles each way. It would have been necessary also to communicate between ranch head-quarters, and the actual location of Survey 1570 which is several miles from the Ranch house, and in very rough territory comprising deep canyon; rough terrain in general, and high hills.

The present re-survey which has been now completed with modern means of transportation required a total of nine full days, and I am absolutely sure that Mr. Nowlin did not in 1909 spend any lenghth of time on this ranch in order to survey and correct 1570.

Furthermore he states that Ernest Ingenhuett and Peter Ingenhuett acted as chain bearers.

My son, Ernest was then 10 years old, and could not have acted as chain bearer--he has no recollection of having done so, and has unequivocally stated so, and my husband who died in 1931--whose name was Ernst could not possibly have acted as chain bearer since he was very 111, and a disability of his feet made long walks absolutely impossible for many years--easily from 1908 to the time of his death in 1931.

My husband had three brothers; Hubert, Paul and Hermann Ingenhuett-all of whom maintained homes in Comfort, and none of whom I believe to have been chain bearers for Frank Nowlin in 1909.

Peter Ingenhuett was born in 1833, and would have been 76 years old at the time of the re-survey in 1909. Mr. Ingenhuett(Peter) was my husbands father, and at his age of 76 years would have been incapable of making the long and difficult walks since he was never a robust man, and besides did not live on the Ranch. I state that neither my husband Ernst; nor my father-in-law Peter Ingenhuett were able to make the survey on foot, and on the ground.

I have further reason for my belief that Frank Nowlin did not actually run this survey on the ground.

My neighbor, Mrs. Betty Flach widow of Arthur Flach--which estate owns Survey 890, and numerous others, wished to have field notes corrected by Frank Nowlin several years before his death, and Mr. Nowlin stated to her that he could correct same in the office, and would not have run them on the ground.
