Dear Sir: - I enclose sketch of part of Lamb Co.
showing location of BLK B. B.S.R.F. & H.E.W.T R.R.C. accor-
ding to field notes of the adjoining Thomson surveys.

N.C. Payne is an actual settler on survey 4, and has applied
for the state school land situated south, east and north
of surveys 1-2 & 4. which has been surveyed by Mr N.K.
Smith of Plainview, Tex. as additional land. His first
location of BLK B. placed it largely in conflict with the Thomson
patented surveys. His second, places it too far north, although
based on the Thomson surveys, due to an excess ^{of 303¹²} in BK T from
the N.W. cor. of survey 1 to the S.W. cor. of survey 25. which ^(survey) I found
on the ground in Feb. 1886. In Jan. 1886 I ran a connecting
line from the S.W. cor. of survey 1. BLK A. in Lubbock Co. (196¹² west
and 54° south from forks of creek) West to North to the N.E. corner
of Capitol league No 736 which was defined by a mid and
4 pits. Thence North along the E. lines of Capitol leagues 728-723,
714, 709, 692, 687, 671, 666, 657, 652, 642 and 637, finding all
the league corners actually made on the ground along this line.
the excess being uniformly 50¹² to the leagues. When I reached
the North Fork of Yellow House draw I went east to look for the S.E.

cor. of survey 29. BLK T. J.A. Thomson, marked by a m.d. 3 pits and
 3 Buffalo heads, $80^{\frac{1}{2}}$ W. of a ravine $4500^{\frac{1}{2}}$ N. from creek - small lake
 $85^{\circ}E 268^{\frac{1}{2}}$. I found a plain corner defined by a m.d. 3 pits
 and two Buffalo heads, $515^{\frac{1}{2}}$ North from creek, but neither lake
 nor ravine. From this corner I ran a line West, at $2800^{\frac{1}{2}}$ passed
 a m.d. 3 pits, at $4680^{\frac{1}{2}}$ pass another m.d. 3 pits, at $10,380^{\frac{1}{2}}$ inter-
 -sect the East line of Capitol League No 642 at a point $4803^{\frac{1}{2}}$ south
 of its N.E. corner, and $357^{\frac{1}{2}}$ North of the point marked by me
 for the S.W. corner of survey 25. BLK T. The result of this meas-
 -urement indicated that the corner marked by a m.d. 3 pits & two
 Buffalo heads was not the S.E. cor. of survey 29, nor the corner
 of any other Thomson survey according to field notes, but un-
 -questionably made by the original surveyor. If the ^{S.E.} corner
 of survey 29 as described in field notes had been made in this
 locality, I surely would have seen it at that time. I have
 recently been over the ground again, and the only point $500^{\frac{1}{2}}$
 North of creek, and from which a possible lake could have existed S.
 $85^{\circ}E 264^{\frac{1}{2}}$, is in the valley $1880^{\frac{1}{2}}$ East and $100^{\frac{1}{2}}$ north from the 3 old pits
 at the S.W. cor. of survey 29. There is no ravine at this point. From the point
 assumed for the S.E. cor. of survey 29 - in line $1880^{\frac{1}{2}}$ E. from S.W. cor. I meas-
 East $812^{\frac{1}{2}}$ & North $500^{\frac{1}{2}}$ and found three dim old pits. (Or what we
 took for pits - forming a triangle) evidently the N.W. cor. of survey 4 BLK
 counter 29398

B. as made by the Thomson surveyor. From this point I constructed the four surveys in BLK B. as shown by sketch prints attached -- In going West from S.W. cor. of sur. 1. BLK A. near forks of creek, Lubbock Co. I found a plain corner every mile for 14 miles, or to the S.W. cor. of the R.R. block based on this line, and at 17 miles 492nd West and 822nd North, came to a large earth monument about 4½ ft high, 20 ft in dia. with a deep circular trench around it.

If your office has not acted on N.K. Smith's last fieldnotes and you wish me to furnish f.m. for the 637 acres, please send me 207.3 blanks. If the land has been awarded to N. C. Payne, please notify me.

Dear Sir:--Your favor of the 13th ~~alt. was duly received~~, together with sketch of surveys 1 to 4, block B, B. S. & F. and H. E. & W. T. Ry. Co. in Lamb County near its east boundary line. After a full investigation of your report together with the field notes of the several surveys, including the N.C. Payne locations under the Act of February 23, 1900, have to say that this is to authorize you to survey and return corrected field notes of surveys No. 1, 2, 3, and 4, block B, B. S. & F. cert. 1793 and H.E. & W.T.RY. Co. cert. 414, as to forever settle the position of the above mentioned four surveys. You will also survey and return corrected field notes for the N.C. Payne survey No. 5, block B to include all the public school land S. E. and N of surveys 1, 2, and 4, block B under his application dated January 16th, 1902, before J.S. Highsmith, Notary Public, Hale Co., Texas, on file in this office in S.F. 3617, Lamb Co.

Also please return field notes of your connecting line from survey No. 1, block A in Lubbock County, West, etc., together with sketch.



RECORDED in the office of the County Clerk, Yankton County, South Dakota, dated February 15th, 1904, by me, Asst. State Surveyor, for the State Surveyor, A. S. Howren, showing the location of B.I.K. B, which is bounded by the state line on the west, by the river on the north, by the river on the south, and by the state line on the east. The boundaries of B.I.K. B are described as follows: Beginning at the intersection of the state line and the river, running eastward along the river to the corner of the state line, thence running southward along the state line to the corner of the state line and the river, thence running westward along the river to the corner of the state line, thence running northward along the state line to the corner of the state line and the river, thence running eastward along the river to the beginning. The area of B.I.K. B is approximately 137.86 acres.





This sketch shows BLK B as located from the Thomson surveys made in Oct. 1882. I was on the ground in Jan. and Feb. 1886 when the corners were fresh, and at that time searched diligently for the N.W. cor. of survey 1. BLK B. B.S. & F. but failed to find it. There are no two points on the creek in this locality that will meet the requirements of the field notes of survey 1 - I meandered the creek.
