 Dear Sir:-

The following is my report on the findings on the ground of surveys Nos., 72, 500, 504, 510, and 1358 in LaSalle County as surveyed by me for T.A. Coleman in Oct., 1918.

Survey 1358, as shown by blue print attached was found to contain 660.2 acres of land an excess of 20 acres of what the original notes called for., this was caused by its boundaries on the west, being definitely established by the east lines of surveys Nos., 324, which is fenced and still has its original north east and south east corners on the ground; survey No. 529 which is also well defined on the ground having its corners as originally marked and placed there by the surveyor on his survey of same. These marked the western boundary of survey 1358. Its eastern boundary is marked by the west line of survey 1357, which is well defined on the ground and the north line of survey No. 803, which is still on the ground and has its original corners. The I & G N., railroad which is crossed by the east line of survey No. 1358, is still in the same place it was when this survey was originally established as found by its call when it crossed said railroad at 954 vs., from its south east corner.

The west lines of surveys Nos., 501, 72, 71, 693 and 500., is the original line run for said surveys, and is well defined on the ground, this established the west line of survey 498, which is also the east boundary of survey No. 1358.

The original N.E. Corner of survey 500 is still on the ground and as well as the west line of 499, the distance 1961 vs is what was found between the east and west line of survey 500., and for this reason it was not cut down to its 1900. vs as originally called for.

The West and east lines of surveys 693 and 71, run converging towards the north and when they reach survey No. 72, this width between them is found to be 1914 vs., and not 1961 as found on sur., No. 500., The old lines is well defined all along by bearings and no confusion is found here., We have run these surveys along this block as far as five miles to the east of these tracts recently surveyed and in almost all cases the original corners were found, some places we found that the miles were in excess by as much found is surveying 500., but all corners are still on the ground to show for it.

Survey No. 72., has all of its corners on the ground and is shown on the sketch just as I found same, this has only an excess of 20 vs north and south and 14 vs east and west. Its west line is very well defined, having an old fence along the original line, and its East line is in a large open field, but its corners are there.

survey No.504,,was found to contain 638.5 acres a little short of its original quantity.

Its east boundary, has an old fence line along the original line of the survey being the west boundary of the Raymond Martin pasture, the corners to the surveys along this line are still on the ground with their original bearings. The north line being the south line of survey No.9, and 510-1/2 is part of the Martin Est. pasture and the corners to same are still on the ground, as well as the orig. N.E. Cor., of 504, which is there an old stake lying besides a new stake set by some recent survey eight or ten years since.

The west boundaries of survey 504, are marked by the east lines of surveys Nos., 509, and 503, which have been well established on the ground having their corners and their original bearings still on the ground, as shown by the blue print attached.

survey No.510, is fixed by its surrounding surveys, this tract has a fence line along its north boundary line, which marks the south boundary line of survey No.298 Atascosa County School land, its East line by the west line of the Martin pasture which is the west line of survey No., 510-1/2, and its south boundary is well defined by the north line of surveys Nos., 508-509. This is what I found on the ground when making these surveys, and I controlled myself by these boundaries.

These surveys appear to be more in conformity with their original calls than any other surveys that I have run across in La-Salle County.

The west lines of surveys 501, 72, 71, 693, and 500, as well as ~~its/eas/~~ their east lines are evident on the ground having followed them in this survey. They have been re-run several times. The town tract of Encinal lies on surveys Nos. 1357, and 1358.

All of these tracts had previously been run out by Mr. Arthur Foster a former county surveyor of this County and also by Sylvester a County surveyor of LaSalle who helped in re-surveying some of this land.
