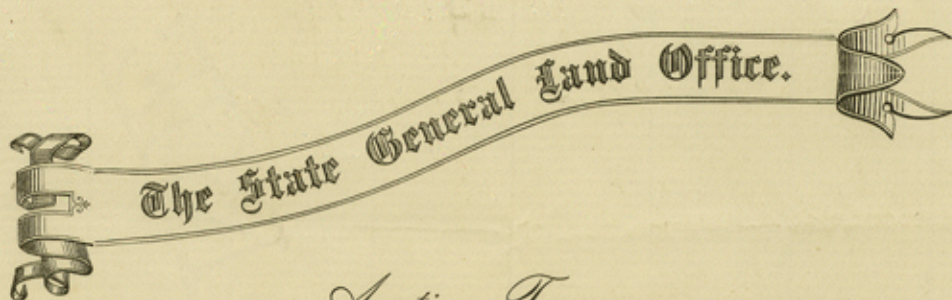

Dear Sir:

In explanation of how the boundaries of the Bridget Haughy League & labor in Live Oak County were located or established, I have this statement to make

1st There is no record in my office of any Survey of the said Haughy league, except the original field notes or Survey as made by William O'Docharty, Surveyor for M^cMullen & M^cGloin's Colony

2nd On the accompanying sketch as prepared by myself, the black lines show how the Survey lies when run out by the O'Docharty field Notes.

3rd The red lines show the boundaries as now held and under fence. These boundaries are recited in certain deeds, of record in the County Clerk's office of this County; by virtue of which deeds, I Surveyed the land for the parties owning it, about the year 1882. I found that these lines and corners described in said deeds, were run out, and corners set many years before by some Surveyor,

But there is no records to show such work of any Surveyor outside of said deeds. These deeds do not recite how the boundaries were fixed.

In fact the way these boundaries are set shows a wholesale grabbing of public domain.

I consider there is no difficulty in running out the lines and boundaries by the original field notes.
