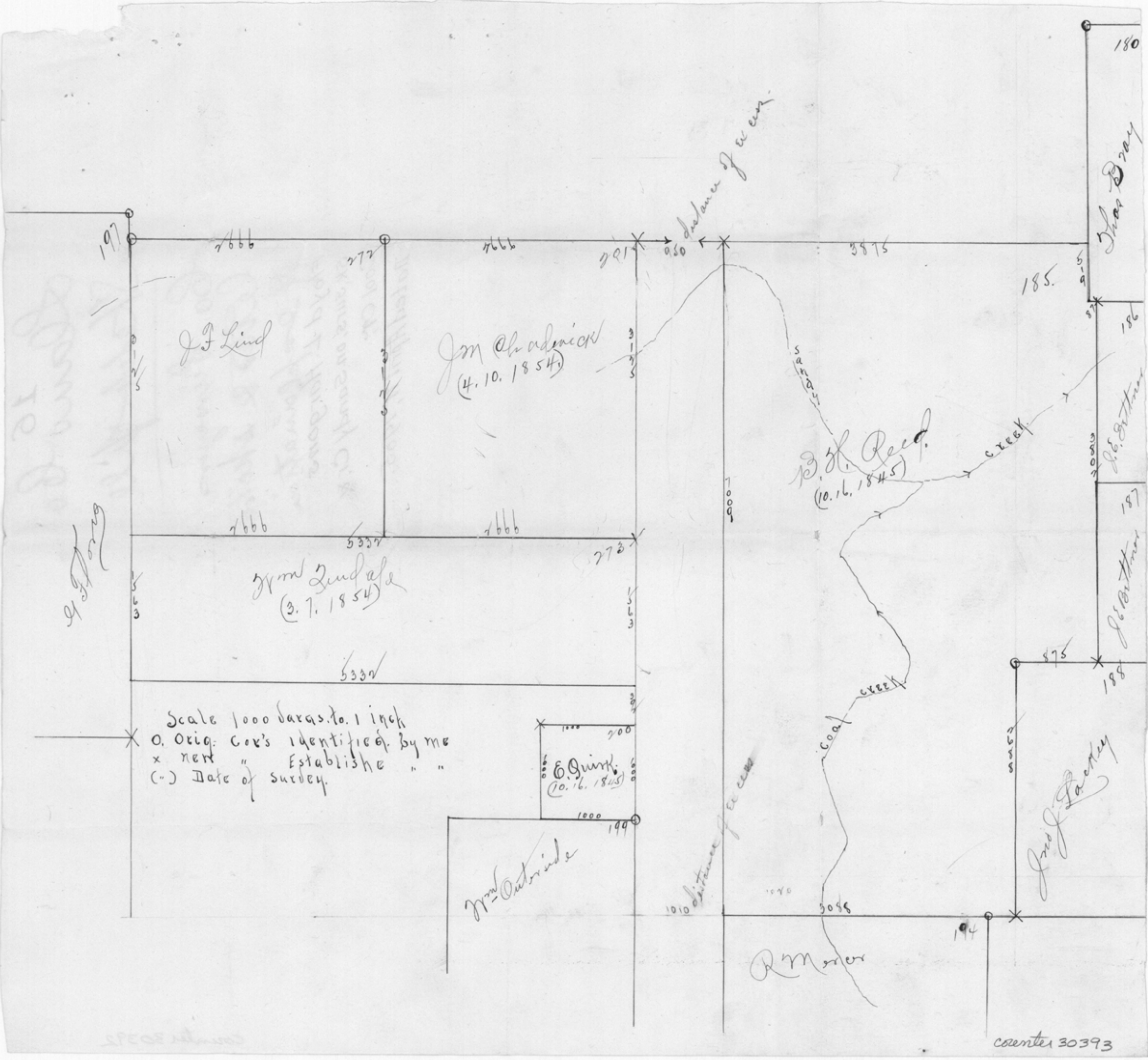

Dear Sir:

Your favor of the 11th inst., together with sketch of explanation received. After investigating the field notes of the several surveys, I find that the Michael Pevite one league and one labor certificate was surveyed covering this territory, beginning at the N.E. corner of Ed Quirk labor No. 200, thence West describing the same bearing trees as called for in survey No. 297 and 298 G. Flora and M. Baxter. About ten years later J. J. Giddings located three 1/3 league certificate on this territory surveyed under the Pevite certificate. The bearing trees described at the N.W. corner of said Pevite are described by J. J. Gidding at the N.W. corner of survey No. 272 J. F. Lind. By reversing the Lind, Chadwick, and Tyndale the vacancy would exist as you show it, that is, between the West line of B. H. Reed and the East line of Chadwick and Tyndale surveys. Please try and identify the common corners of 201 and 272, that is, the S.E. corner of 272 and S.W. corner 201. You indicate on your sketch that you have identified the N.E. corner of 272 and N.W. corner 201. Would state that the field notes do not describe any, - simply a stake. For your information see rough pencil sketches herewith marked A and B. In returning field notes for this vacancy you are requested to file a certified sketch and field notes of your connecting line describing how and what original corners were identified by you, giving the actual course and length of old lines, &c.
