Your favor of the 23rd ult, has been received.

In regard to the plan of resurveying block R G, in the eastern part of Lubbock county, will say that it takes its position course and distance from the southwestern corner of section 1, L. I. & M. Co, near the town of Lubbock.

It should be established in conformity with corners in adjoining blocks established by you about one year ago.

It is useless to enter into details with you as to the construction of that block, as you are already familiar with conditions there and have the necessary data.

The Attorney General is still busy with tax suits and has not yet reached a consideration of the Lofton matter.

Dear Sir.-

Inclosed I hand you corrected field notes for block R B, also a copy of my instructions which I attach for your convenience.

While on the ground I learned that some confusion is caused by your office not having data to show the position of preemptions around block C. I did not have any data or instructions regarding these preemptions but learned while on the ground that the preemptions north of block C are in conflict with block C nearly 1/4 of a mile, and preemptions south and east of block C are too far north and west and are also in conflict with block C. Surveyor Knight did not leave room for block C between preemptions. I was shown two or three of these preemption corners and can give you my connection to them if desired.

Please let me know of any amounts due for binding field notes for county surveyors and I will remit.
