Hon. John J. Terrell,

Austin, Texas.

Dear Sir:-

I could not get a tracing made showing the Kokernot ranch in Lubbock county in time to carry with me to your office so my transitman, Jeff Williams, made the tracing after I left and tried to get it to me by special delivery. I was called to Fort Worth a day earlier than I expected, so the map came too late for me to explain. Under the circumstances it is necessarily a skeleton map, showing only the connections to the SW of 1 Block A; to the original corners on the ground including the abandoned corners which were supposed to be on located land, and which are shown in one of Mr. Powels depositions. While I traced these corners for the information that they may give, you will notice, on the map, that I construct from the corners described in the original field notes and swing the courses ^{of lines going} east and west to conform with the original corners, and I place all the north and south lines N. 0°40' W., keeping them parallel.

The sketch shows the Base I have placed on the south and West of Block S, also the connection made to the Sw of 732, also the connection made to the Lubbock corner, and the way all of this will plat out with my work in Blocks RG and C. *2/139*
One connection that Jeff omitted is from the original

pile of stone at the SE of 38 block S to the NW of X survey 1 D19, this is not reported but will be soon, the connection is beginning at the SE of 38 block S, Thence N 500 varas Thence E ~~XXXXXXXXXXXXXX~~ *1664* to the NW corner of survey 1 D19, and this corner is placed by constructing surveys true course and distance from the Plum Creek Monument..
