I have in my possession Mr. Hayes' original field book which I think I showed you when I was there. This field book covers his run from Section 141 in the White River district to the Cap Rock, 13 miles ^{south} of the Cobb corner, and then his field book from there goes in a rambling course from about where Post City is now located on Section 1227, J. V. Massey Survey, in a south-easterly direction, but giving very meager notes of what he did.

I also have in my possession Mr. Hayes' transcript made by him of what he did in Garza and Lynn Counties on his May 1878 trip.

If these field notes would be of any service to you, I would be only too glad to loan them to you for the purpose of your making a copy therefrom, but as they are not my property, I would certainly want them returned as soon as possible.

His notes of the May trip refer to the line of corners which were put up north from Camp Branch corner and you will discover from the dates thereof, and also from the dates of the surveys of sections lying to the west which are numbered below 600, that he made this survey north from Camp Branch and also running west from a mile north of Camp Branch in the direction of Guthrie Lake, were put in prior to the return of the surveys of sections numbered less than 600, and Mr. Hayes told me that he made this survey running north from Camp Branch and west from a point a mile north of Camp Branch for the purpose of locating all the surveys which he made, the sections being numbered less than 600, although I believe there are a few of the 600 series, but only a few, which were located by Mr. Hayes, and the field notes signed by Mr. Brannin.

If there is anything further that we can be of any assistance to you in giving you information as to original corners which are located in this territory, or anything else along that line, we would only be too glad to furnish you with the same, and if it was necessary in order to make this work of an official nature so that it would have the necessary force if Mr. Robinson so desired and thought advisable he could, acting under the law I believe, appoint me as a state surveyor, and then I could give this information officially. I only suggest this latter as a possibility in asking that I be appointed as a state surveyor, as I do not personally care for such appointments only for the purpose of getting this information into the Land Office in the best possible manner, and my interest with Mr. Post is such that I desire to get into the Land Office all of the possible data that is obtainable, which data would tend to more permanently tie the land in this section of Texas more firmly to the earth. As it ^{now} seems to be in a balloon floating around and only dropping to the earth sometimes when the balloon is punctured, and then only a short time, it arises again and goes somewhere else.

You no doubt will recall that when the writer was in Austin last November that he told you that when he got the tracing completed of the old "Morris" working sketch for Garza and Lynn Counties, he would send you a blue print. You will recall that this working sketch was the one that Mr. Ferguson has the original tracing, and Mr. Ferguson was kind enough to loan me his tracing, so I have had our draughtsman make up a drawing and tracing therefrom, which drawing and tracing our draughtsman and myself have each carefully compared with the Ferguson tracing and find it to be the same with the exception of the notes which were about the margin of that tracing. These notes are the notes that are referred to by the red figures, 1 to 15 inclusive, which are on the various sections, red 4 being on Section 1361. These side notes we have typewritten and am sending you with said blue print a copy of such side notes.

You will note that we have put our regular drawing number on this map, also a note telling what this map is. We hope that this will be of some service to you.

You will remember that when I was there that you showed me the original sketches which were turned in by Mr. Hayes, covering this part of the country and as far west as Double Lakes, and that you promised me at that time that as soon as John Pritchett got through with the work that he was on, that you would have him make a duplicate drawing of these sketches. We would like for you to answer the same question in regard to the award of a part of the same strip to Mr. S. M. McDaniels which lies further north.


We would like to know what position the Land Office is going to take in regard to these strips since the decision of this case. We would like to know this as soon as possible so that we will know what to do in the matter.

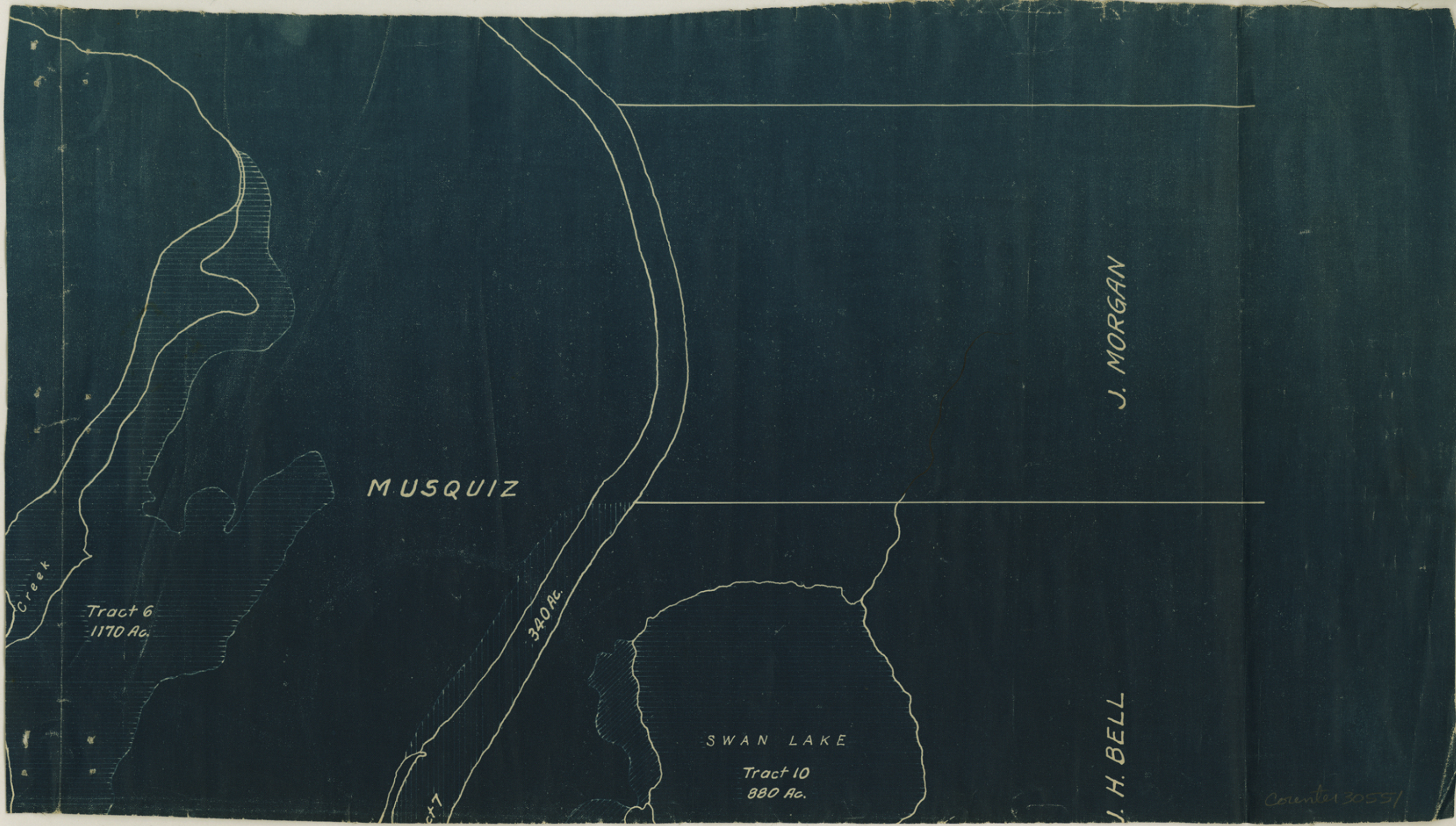
