Dear Sir:- When I was at Austin last week the draftsman who was compiling new map of McCulloch County called my attention to certain matters and asked me to investigate and write him etc.

I inclose map made by Mr. Dod that I think shows the correct position of the surveys in vicinity of the C.A. Linke surveys 331 & 332, and Werstofer surveys 329 & 330, few miles south west from Brady, and being one of the places that was troubling the draftsman. There are some seeming inconsistencies in the way the tracts are fitted, but there is in Land Office a long, full and tolerably clear explanation of matter made by Mr. Dod several years ago. The Office accepted his statement at the time. The inclosed map shows same (or practiacly same) as the plat certified to by Doty and which the draftsman had before him when I was talking to him.

In regard to the conflict between Fisher & Miller survey 2226 and the Geo. Dietz survey 172, I am not able to say exactly where the real conflict is because I cannot find that any surveyor has worked matter out fully. Both tracts belong to same party and party has not gone to expense of having matter fully investigated by surveyors. I am inclined to think that the loss should be on survey 2226. The inclosed map squares 172 & 173 from the corners on the east and leavs no conflict with 2226. This was probably done because no corners could be found on west and the surveys were put in by course and distance from east -- which is generally correct rule to go by, and may

be in this case -- and will be if nothing can be found to shove west side down. The only thing I find to indicate that shortage in the wexixknawn line between the well known corner at S.W.cor. of Bader survey 168 (which is one mile south of S.W.cor. surv. 2226) and the well known corner at M.E.cor. of Boetye survey 175 (which should be one mile north of N.W.cor. of 173) is that xMxxx Madxhasxindianted xthe branchxthatxfieldxacsbfedaxhihjafgermaanxtedatsyaxxagaanxfehani is in 2226 is the fact that Mr. Dod (on the plat book I have and that you had for some time) indicates that the branch that is called for to be 410 varas south of N.W.cor. of 2226 (this call is in field notes for survey 138, west of 2226) and 1490 varas north of S.W.cor.of 2226, ix to be 600or 700 varas north of S.W.cor. of 2226.I h ave not the exact distance. If no corners cand be found between said two old and well established corners (S.W. 168 & N.E. 175) it is probable that the shortage should be placed as on the inclosed map--and Mr. Dod ran the line and found no corners. It would probably be nearer right, till more information is h ad, to map the surveys as on inclosed map. The Dietz & Boethye will not corner together, but there is error somewhere, and thiat will make shortage in the junior survey -- 68.

Return map when you are through with it -- I am in no hurry to have it back. It has been made some time and there where some mistakes in it; but it is correct in most cases. Is not same map I sent you with
