Dear Sir:

In reply to yours of the 29th Jan. I state that I have been delayed by absence, sickness, and bad weather, but am enclosing herewith Field Notes, Corrected, of Survey No. 38, South 1/2, and South West part of Survey No. 14 B.B. By. Co. I based this work on the Williams work, hence, it was necessary to make some changes in my former Field Notes.

I note what you say with respect to the Williams survey in 1829, that he calls for the north line of section No. 38 to be 2043 yards in length. I could not find any established corners on the North line of 38. I began at the S.E. corner of section No. 64, running West I found the actual measurements to be as indicated on plat herewith enclosed. I retraced my steps on the line from the S.W. 65 to the S.E. corner 63 and found my measurement to be correct. I arrived at the acreage of section No. 38 by running two miles North from each of the corners at the S.E. 64 and the S.W. 60, then going to the S.E. corner of sec. 38 and running West four miles, striking the corners previously marked by me, proving that no excess exists North and South. I found no Williams work on this line, but found a well defined line of old stone mounds, dividing the excess, which is 200 yards, equally between all the surveys in that block, which I adopted as the correct thing in my former work.

I also found stone mounds at regular intervals , dividing the excess equally, on the line run by me, dividing sections 37, 38, and 39 in halves. This line had been run before by some surveyor who had the same idea as myself.

The lands bought by Moses and Woodward and those they want patented are inclosed in red on the plat herein, and is fenced with wolf proof fencing.

As to the South West part of Survey No. 14, I made some corrections in that also, making 181.7 acres and 544.7 acres respectively as shown on plat. To arrive at the correct location of Survey No. 14, I began at the S.W. corner of 511, locating the original corners of Surveys 493, 511, and 510 . Then I began at a stone mound in the West line of 510 as called for in the Field Notes of 14,- then ran South to the S.W. corner of 510 , finding the distance to be excessive. Then I ran for course and distance as called for in the original Field Notes, falling short on reaching the East line of 64. From this point , I ran ^{North} only to the Moses and Woodward fence for the part they want patented, having previously run 950 varas further to N.E. cor. 37,-----.

I have been more than usually careful in making the measurements in this work, and hope that it will meet with your approval. It will be of no use to return the papers to me for correction again in the event you do not elect to approve them, for ^I could not make any further change, unless it should be back to my former plan of dividing excess equally ~~between~~ among all the surveys.

I also found some marks of other intervals, dividing the space equally
on the line by the dividing sections 27, 28, and 29 in halves. The line had
been run before by some surveyor who had the same idea as myself.
The lands bought by Mass and Woodard and those they were patented are enclosed
lined on the first plan, and is marked with white lines.
As to the South West part of Survey No. 14, I made some corrections in that also,
making 181.7 acres and 244.7 acres respectively as shown on plan. To arrive at the
correct location of Survey No. 14, I began at the S.W. corner of 211, following
the original corners of Surveys 428, 211, and 210. Then I began at a stone mound
in the West line of 210 as called for in the Field Notes of 14, - then ran South
to the corner of 210, finding the distance to be accurate. Then I ran for
course and distance as called for in the original Field Notes, falling short on
reaching the East line of 24 from this point, I ran only to the Mass and Woodard
line for the part they were patented, having previously run 230 acres further to
A. B. cor. 27.

I have been extremely careful in making the measurements in this work,
and hope that it will meet with your approval. It will be well to have the
papers to me for correction again in the event you do not object to approve them,
but could not make any further change, unless it should be back to my former
plan of dividing among equally between among all the surveys.
