Dear Sir:-

When sending me the last maps I ordered you wrote

that you had a blue print map of Montgomery County, price either three or three dollars and fifty cents I do not now remember which. ~~XXXX~~ I have decided to get one of them and am sending you herewith post office money order for three dollars and fifty cents for which please send me one of them.

Also I have been notified by the Commissioner's Court of Liberty County that the surveyor of that county has been instructed by them to ~~xx~~ survey, mark and establish the ~~xxxx~~ county line between Liberty and Montgomery counties and it devolves upon the Commissioners' court of this county to appoint a surveyor to meet their surveyor. Therefore I am wanting to get the field notes of *between Montgomery & Liberty Counties* this county or at least the field notes of the dividing line, and I am writing to ask if you can furnish same from your office. If you can furnish the field notes please send them at once with your bill and I will remit to you upon receipt of them. Liberty county I believe was cut off of this county and it may be that ~~xxxxxx~~ its line which was established next to Montgomery county would have to govern.

If the map above mentioned is only three dollars and you can furnish the field notes called for, credit me with the other fifty cents and send bill for balance with field notes, otherwise return in stamps or check as convenient.

Dear Sir:

I am in receipt of yours of the 3rd Inst. with reference to the boundary line between the counties of Montgomery and Liberty, and in reply beg to say that there are no certified field notes of that line on file in this office in so far as I can find. The line between these counties seems to be the old west ~~branch~~ ^{line} of Liberty County as defined by the Act of December 18, 1837, which is as follows:

"Beginning on the Gulf of Mexico at the southwestern corner of the county of Jefferson; thence north along the western boundary line of said county to the Big Sandy creek (thence down said creek with said county line, to its entrance into the Neches river); thence up said river to the southeastern corner of the county of Houston; thence south of west along the southern boundary line of said county to the Trinity river; thence across the river in the same direction to a point nine miles distant; thence in a direct line to the head of Cedar bayou; thence down said bayou to its entrance into the gulf of Mexico; thence along said gulf with all its meanderings, including the Trinity bay, to the place of beginning."

The Act of May 24, 1838 defining the boundary of Montgomery County follows the N.W. and W. line of Liberty County. There have been several counties created since out of the old Montgomery and Liberty counties, but it seems after deducting these the line between the present, or what is left of the old Liberty and Montgomery counties, would have to be determined in accordance with the Act of Dec. 18, 1837 by beginning at the S.E. corner of Houston County, as defined by the Act of June 12, 1837, and following its south line for the course to the Trinity river, and then across the river on that course nine miles, thence a line from that point due to the head of Cedar Bayou would determine the course and define the line between these counties, that is, the present Montgomery

and Liberty Counties.

As before stated, there have been no field notes of the old district line filed in this office, so far as I can find at this time. I am pretty sure, however, that this line has been run and marked in the early days, but just when and whether field notes were ever filed here I cannot positively say, as I cannot find any such at this time. For your information, will state however, that all of the maps have the line between these counties delineated thereon and the course seems to be N. 20 1/2 W.

I shall send you a blue print copy of the Montgomery county map just as soon as the tracing of the official map is completed. That I think, will be in a few days.
