Dear Sir

At last I have the pleasure to report the result of the investigation of your report dated May 27th 1903 of corrections in block T, Beldy, Seal & Forward in Motley County.

Upon investigating I find that the first date of surveys 1 to 12 are dated Aug. 24/75. 13 to 22 Aug 25th. 23 to 32 Aug 26th and survey 33 & C dated Aug 27th/75, all filed in G.L.O. Dec. 9/75.

The field notes of survey no. 1 in its beginning call was corrected prior to the issuing of patent, as to read, "said stake is South 2 1/88 vars from Southwest corner of survey no. 2 X 81 ft 4" this would place survey nos. 1 & 2 ^{in conflict to the extent of 12 1/88 vars.} with surveys 8 & 7 same block, that is, by constructing 7 and 8 from the recognized S. E. cor. of survey no. 3 X same block. Again the bearings called for at the N. E. corner of surv. no. 1 Blk T for peak bearings, and without all could be made to harmonize, otherwise should be disregard, (you, as well as Mr. Cubanks admit, that it is impossible to harmonize the three bearing calls) hence I am of the opinion that the block should be

East and North from the S. E. corner
of Survey no. 34 Block T, giving ^{no excess},
practically agree with the call at
the S. E. cor. of sur. no. 33 for Jones
creek, also the crossing of said creek
in sur. no. 5. This would then
permanently locate Block J B, and
avoid a conflict of 206 var. between
the two blocks, and close up the
vacancy between surveys 63 & 66 Blk. J B.
and surveys 21 & 22 Blk. T.

I send you herewith rough final
copy of field notes of survey no. 1 Blk T
as balanced, together with copy of
surveyors certificate of correction, also
copy of original sketch of Blak T
filled with the field notes.

M. and the F.P.Knott land , at the same time I wrote you that I would soon send in a report of all the vacant land enclosed by these blocks ; but have been delayed in doing so awaiting your ruling on the report of Mr. R.M.Kenney's work on Blk. T. Which indirectly affects Block J.B., and block J.B.forms the south boundary of the above mentioned vacancy for a number of miles.

I write to know if it is possible for you to take up that work and pass on it soon,Mr.Kenney and I are both anxious to have that ruling made

as our work is virtually blocked awaiting your ruling as to location of the N.E. Cor.Survey No. 1. Block T. and after that to determine the policy of distributing the excess in said Block , and then to outline a policy for determining the position of the respective surveys in Block J.B.,

On the ground it seems impractical to locate the N.E.Corner of Survey No. 1, Blk. T. by the peak calls for the reason the peaks are not in sight from the point from which their bearings would conform to the Field Note description, The people who own this land are anxious to have you make this ruling so that they may have their land permanently located.

This matter has been before the General Land Office for a number of years in a loose description, but Mr. Kenney filed with you a few months ago a

N. E. #1 - Blk. T. and makes no further call
for Blk. T. - This being the case Blk. T. P.
would lose the excess of \$16 vs. N. & P. that
shows up in Blk. T. and - Surveyor SK⁵



B&K. T. - B.S. & F. - Begin at the original S.E.
corner of said Survey. From which a cotton
wood stump of the original bearing tree was
S. 35 $\frac{1}{2}$ W. 74 m. Peak S. 34 W. (original note case
for S. 32 W.) Thence North 1900 m. a check peg for
N.E. corner of 34. Thence East 5700 m. a check
pt. for S.E. corner of 23 - Thence North 3800 m.
to a check pt. for N.E. # 21. Thence East 3800 m.
a check st. for S.W. # 5 - Thence East at 1311 m.
the west bank of Pease River, at 1900 m a
check pt. the S.E. # 6 - 250 m. S. of the S. bank
of the river. Thence East 1900 m. a check
pt. for S.E. # 4 at a point 350 m. S. of the
S. bank of the river. The river here runs nearly
due E. & W. for $\frac{1}{2}$ mile. Thence East 612 m.
a point. Thence North at 350 m. S. bank of
Pease river - at a point where it runs East
and changes about 100 m. wide - in fact
a case for the river here is not very definite
as the banks are low and subject to sudden
changes - at 7806 m. a check peg 2448 m.
South of the S.E. corner of 24 - B&K. 4 - T. & P.
R.R. Co. as I located that corner from N.E. cor-
ner of 23 - same Blk. by its case for a large
ct. wood. near mouth cr. (Tom Basel) S. 48 E. 570 m.
I find no original mark on the tree, but
from the course of the river, and the gen-
eral formation of the country at the mouth
of Tom Basal, having high banks on west
side till it gets nearly to the river, and in the
bottom on the west bank, there are large SK⁸


and my judgment is that course and
distance from S.E. 24 Blk. 4 - should lo-
cate the N.E. of #1- Blk. T. B. S. & F. and
the N.E. #1. locates Blk. T. B. -

The question - if so located will be - how
to distribute the excess through the Block.

giving strong evidence to a surveyor that the creek
could not have been further west in the last
30 years, together with the further evidence that
a trail from the Mexican mountain, made
by several different Surveyors (I have never made
that run) locate the dr. E. of #23 practically at
same point, as the bearing tree at the mouth of
Tom Ball - Besides there are several old settlers
here & have been familiar with the country
at mouth of Tom Ball, and they all say it
has been where it is now for the last 15 years.

Returning to the point 2488 m. S. of S.E. #24
which is the dr. E. #1. ext. 2'67 A. B. & W. -

The calls of the field notes at this corner are as
follows - At point 2488 m. S. of S.E. #24. Belk. 4.
T. & P. R. R. Co. - Drutague Peak dr. 8³/₄ N.

House Mt. dr. 8³/₄ N.

Round Top mt. dr. 4¹/2 W.

I find these calls as follows. (Va. 10.40)

Drutague dr. 4¹/2, 40 W. - House Top mt. N. 8², 4¹/2 W.
Round Top mt. dr. 40 W. - There is no position
that will fit all the calls - If you fit one
you will lose the others. If you use a lesser
va. you will then lose the river calls. —

Now as to the point where course and
distance from S.E. corner of #34 would lo-
cate this corner. — It will place it in a ravine
running North, and west of it is a high
ridge, so that anywhere dr. or S. for a half mile
it was impossible for the Surveyor to have taken
these bearings on the peaks, for they are not in
sight. I do not think there is any question about
the S.E. corner of #34 (the Tom Haudie corner) for the
tree was standing and cut only a few years ago.
I think there is hardly a doubt as to the dr. E. #23
Belk. 4. (Tom Ball corner)
