It appears by the map of Nacogdoches County that two small surveys near this town marked Hoya, one surveyed for J. V. Hoya assignee of J. M. Martinis and the other for Charles Floyd conflict with the larger one of Nepomuceno de la Cueva and on reference to the Original Grant in your Office it will be seen that the large survey can not be in its proper position inasmuch as it crosses a little stream called the Castanas whereas by the Grant it should be bounded by it and for other reasons, did the large grant not cross the Castanas no conflict would appear on the map.

I hope the enclosed communication from Mr. Nelson our County Surveyor together with an examination of the Grant and explanations from Mr. W. Parker will enable you to patent the two small surveys above referred to

Mr. Abbott and myself arrived in about 10 days after leaving your place Mr. A's health about the same

Nacoydoche Aug. 24 1866
Hon. Geo. W. Wall
Com^r of the Genl Land Office

Sir I have
been requested by Mr Francis O A
Hoya of this place to communicate
to you respecting a certain tract of Land
which was surveyed near this Town
in the name of the Co Hoya of J M Mar-
tinez consisting of one Lot or and some odd
acres. It appears from the representation
of the same on the Co Mapa de Conflict
with the grant of Repomuceno de la Cruz
de and for that reason can not be pa-
tented. This grant of La Cruz was un-
der without any special authority for so-
doing and without particular regard
to the calls of the grant as will appear
on examination of the same on file in
the Land office.

I have perused the Title in connection
with Mr Amory and find that the "Canada
de las Castañas" or Bayou Castano forms
the Boundary of the Grant, and can
not therefore be crossed by the lines of
the same. That being the case the

Survey of this Hoya can not conflict
with La Cerda

These remarks will have the same
bearing on a Survey of 2000 acres in
the name of Charles Hoya

In ~~addition~~ ^{addition} to what I have
already ^{said} I certify that the little
creek or Bayou Castano, which forms
the Boundary of the foregoing survey
is particularly known to the oldest inhab-
itants as such and is the same that
is called for in the title of La Cerda
