Sir:— I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your communication of the 13th inst. calling my attention to sections four & five of an Act entitled "An Act supplementary to & amendatory of An Act to give each corporate county of this State its own county surveyor, map and records," &c. In reply I report that I have in my office a certified map of the survey in Navarro County drawn from the records of Robertson Land District, of which this was formerly a portion, and acknowledged to be correct by Thos. J. Oliver, Dist surveyor, R. L. D. on the 30th day of December 1858.

I also have in my office a certified copy of the transcript of the field notes of the survey

lying in this county & formerly constituting a part of said Dist. - beginning on page 1, Book "A" & ending on page 346, Book "B", certified to by Wm. J. Oliver, Dist. Surveyor, R. L. D. on the 30th Dec. 1858.

I think that I can safely say that the records of this office are complete, the field notes of surveys made from & after Dec 30th 1858 to the present date, having been recorded by the different County Surveyors of this County.
