Mr. Rupert C. Allen, Ochiltree, Texas. Dear Sir:

I have yours of the 22nd ultimo in which you enclosed a sketch showing surveys Nos. 745 to 747 and 749 to 752, in block 43, H. & T. C. in Ochiltree County.

You wish to know whether or not you have property placed the excess in school sections as indicated by this sketch. According to your sketch it would seem that there is excess in these sections north and south as well as east and west, and if that is true you do not confine the individual patented surveys to 640 acres because the north and south distances are given 1908 varas and the east and west distances 1900 varas, and some of the north and south distances are as much as 1911 and 1913 varas.

Now, for your information will state that the individual surveys in this block are patented. They were patented on the original field notes. Corrected field notes of a resurvey of the school sections were filed some years ago. They show excess in the whole block.

Now, while the patents are outstanding in the individual surveys this department could not recognize resurvey field notes of the school sections giving the latter all of the excess and confining the individual survey to only 640 acres each, because to do this the calls in the patents would have to be discarded. So, 11 corrected field notes are to be filed for the school sections while the patents on the individual surveys are outstanding it will be necessary to pro rate the excess between the school and the individual sections.

If the patents were not outstanding on the individual surveys, then a different question would arise and the manner suggested in your letter would possibly be the correct way of resurveying the lands.

If owners of the individual sections want to have their patents cancelled and take out new ones new patents could only issue for 640 acres each, giving the school sections all the excess. However the matter of surrendering the patents would be a matter entirely with the owners. If they do not want to surrender the patents this department cannot in any way dispose of the excess while may be included within the bounds of their respective surveys.
