

Weatherford, Parker County, Texas.

October the 17th 1859

Mrs Francis M White commissioner of the  
General Land Office at Austin Texas  
Dear Sir, from the calls of the T J Shaw  
Survey, the SE corner of said Survey is 2800  
varas N $45^{\circ}$ E from the NW corner of the  
Leon County School Land. The SE corner  
of the A H Onstott 53 acre Survey  
is 10 varas S $60^{\circ}$ W from said Shaw's  
NE corner. The SW corner of the  
James A Yeomans 80 acre Survey is  
201 varas N $76^{\circ}$ E from the NE corner  
of the James A Yeoman 80 acre Survey  
could not extend along in the same  
direction with the Northwestern Boundary line  
of the Leon County School Land more  
than  $35\frac{1}{2}$  varas <sup>from the NW corner of said Leon County School Land</sup>. And again the  
SE corner of the Jesse Thomas 32.0  
acre Survey is N $30^{\circ}$ W from the NE  
corner of said Leon County School Land  
and the South East boundary of said Jesse  
Thomas extends from its SE corner S $60^{\circ}$ W  
950 varas, and the Davis Criswell Survey  
extends in the same direction about 750 varas  
Southwest of said Jesse Thomas's SW  
corner, and the Wyatt Williams Survey  
extends S $60^{\circ}$ W 475 varas from said  
Criswell's SW corner, so that the

corner of the Wyatt William Survey  
cannot extend along the NW boundary  
of said Leon County School Land, in a  
direction from  $16^{\circ} W$  more than about  $2175$   
varas, consequently there must necessarily  
be left a space of about 800 varas  
between the western boundary of the Wyatt  
Williams and the Eastern boundary of the  
James A Yeoman surveys. I have not  
the slightest idea that they conflict.
