Dear Mr. Simpson:

This will confirm my telephone conversation of this morning, and is also with further reference to your letter of September 21, regarding the N. E. corner of Block 16, University Land in Pecos County.

As previously stated, I have given the matter of construction of these University Blocks and their exterior boundary lines a great deal of thought and study, especially keeping in mind the fact that the construction as approved, which will do the least violence to the interior lines as laid out by Mr. Frank Friend, will cause the least disturbance and inconvenience to the present occupants and leaseholders of these surveys.

With that thought in mind, I have decided that the acceptance of the N. E. corner of Block 16, as located by Mr. Friend, is the logical thing to do in this instance, especially considering the fact that of four locations made by four different surveyors, no two are the same.

Therefore, the north boundary line of Block 16 will be a line running due west from this corner as located by Mr. Friend, and the east boundary line will be a line running in a southwesterly direction from this same corner through the old monument 103.7 varas south of Lea's corner, as described in the photostatic copy of Mr. J. H. Walker's letter, which was recently mailed to you.
