

I, John E. Baumgartner County Surveyor of Polk County Do,
 hereby Certify, that the annexed Sketch is on the true position of
 this league, situated on Big Sandy Creek and in Polk County,
 ascertained by Measurement and examination on the ground, from
 which the following field notes and Explanations are made:

Beginning, first 14th Cone League N^o
 Said league is 4835 bars from N^W to S^E, and 4856 s's from N^E to
 S^W, The Polk County School land Survey Conflict on the S^W of
 Said league 286 s's by 5000 N, although the Said School land Survey
 call for beginning corner, at the S^W corner of said league Survey
 old corner, and old line, running N^W, well marked to the N^E
 corner of said School land Survey and there call for the said
 Cone's N^W corner, but the Medina State Survey, call also for the
 same at his intersection with the S^W corner of the R Wilbur
 Survey; but, there is no line running S⁴⁵ E from this point,
 which should conflict with the said School land, also with
 the J. Chipman Survey and a small portion of J. C. Darden's
 Survey, and closing at the Juan Falcon most northern corner,
 but no line on said course which caused the Error

The field notes in preparing corner, beginning 2000 s's
 from the beginning corner of league N^o 3, and at the beginning corner of
 league N^o 4, thence N⁴⁵ W 5000 s's, mound & stake from a Hickory 18
 in Dix now existing as for the ash, only few fragments and the place do
 prove that the said Falcon's N^E corner is 230 s's S⁴⁵ W from J. C. Darden
 S^E corner, of his presumption Survey thence S⁴⁵ W at 4114 s's crossed
 the Eastern line of Marie Lindley Survey, and from thence no more line to
 be seen Westwardly, except the line of said Lindley Survey, which run
 N⁸⁵ W, the South line of the Emanuel old Survey, is well marked and it
 is N⁴⁵ W 175 s's from the North line of the Falcon Survey, length of it 5000 s's
 and the 2 School land Surveys, as well as the Natman Labor & the J. Chipman
 320 acres Surveys, are bounded South by said line which have caused
 the Error of the Cone Survey.

3th The Thomas Colville

The field notes call for Beginning corner, at the S^W corner of a

League Survey for D^{is} 14 14 Cone, and by the distance of the Crossing Water Course, on its Northern line, it prove that Said Colville league is N^o 4 and adjoining the Juan Falcon League Survey on the West, and on the East, the 2 quarter of leagues in the name of C^o W Thompson & A Willie.

4th = The Escubedo

The L^o I Hampton is the league N^o 2, and Big Sandy Creek those not cross its north line. Therefore, the Escubedo league can not be on the north of Said Hampton's league, Although the Crossing of the Water Course those not correspond with the field notes exactly, being mostly on the Colville league and do conflict with the C^o W Thompson & A Willie 1/4 of league survey.

5th = The L^o I Hampton league N^o 2

The beginning point of this league is well identified at the crossing of Big Sandy Creek, just below the bridge, and leading from Livingston to Standish. Its bearings are all true, except the South - W^{est} 51^o 15' which is on the N^o 2, and made the same measure. This league conflict with the D^{is} Nash Survey and which will know better the amount after a month or so.

6th = The Franziar Cañada league N^o 1.

The beginning point of this league is at the same of the Long I Hampton league, only running reversed course, the N^o E line is little short and the S^o E corner's connection with the S^o N^o M^oller's presumption, the true survey is N^o 44^o E 666^o to S^o W corner of said survey, the S^o E line of this league is not marked yet, and the S^o W line was marked, when Surveyor Jackson made the survey of J David & Coulter. This league conflict also with the D^{is} Nash Survey.

7th = The Henry W Augustino

Beginning 2 1/2 miles N^o W from where this line cross Big Sandy Creek & at the S^o E corner of John D Nash league survey. Thence N^o 40^o E, the distance full short of 262^o 1/2, to comply with the field notes, the corner is 90^o 1/2 S 45^o W from the S^o W line of the Castaneda league survey. The Eastern line of this league was marked N^o 10, by Surveyor Jackson. It is at the same time that the S^o W line of said Castaneda was marked, and it makes the said Eastern line, cross Big Sandy Creek at 235^o 1/2 before reaching its S^o E corner, whereas the field notes sets it 150^o 1/2 East of said

8th The Co^l James Morgan

The S^W Corner, is 3000 ft 150 ft from George W. Tolson Survey. Thence run
S 40 E variation of 30' E the line well marked, and at 3500 ft entered in
the Augustins league survey, at 4250 ft to S E Corner, the same being
nearly the N E Corner of a 1/4 of a league survey in the name Richard
Line Continued. Same course. Thence at 2218 ft cross said Augustins South
line, at the N E Corner of a prumtion survey in the name of L. B. Destet
and being N 70 E 1870 ft from said Augustins S W Corner league
Survey.

9th Mary Thomas

The Beginning Corner of said league is at the S E Corner
of Henry W. Augustins. Thence N 70 E at 262 ft Big Sandy Creek,
14 ft wide, @ S E, at 1102 ft pass the S E Corner of Abel Cain Survey,
at 2500 ft the N E Corner of said Thomas Survey; from the bearing there
is only the pole remaining 12 in Di. 7 ft N 25 W 3 7/10 ft; made
another with a pine 10 in Di. 7 ft N 25 E 8 ft, at 28 ft, same course the
S W Corner of. M. Field M. Cornack, at 262 ft an old Corner of a Survey
in the name M. Veill, and 500 ft N W Corner of M. Wittington Survey; as the
Eastern line of said Thomas never been marked, I become more particular
Thence from S E Corner, as pertained by other surveys, N 50 E, at the
at 2200 ft
Crossing of an ancient trail, at 3650 ft entered thick bogall, and at
5330 ft the distance of the Corner, but no sign to be found. Some distance
around it, after making few marks on Sundria trees for Corner. Accepted

10th The Andrew Morales

This league in the field notes makes the Beginning Corner of the
S E Corner of the Mary Thomas. Thence N 50 E at 800 ft, a trail,
every now and then mtd a fore & aft and few side tracks, in thick
Mormack, occasionally through bogall. at 1200 ft Cam bottom, at 1350 ft
Cross a branch 2 ft wide @ S W, at 1600 ft another 2 ft wide @ S W,
at 2050 ft on the East bank of big sandy Creek, at 2150 ft on another
bank of same Creek, line running in the middle of it, at 2330 ft
Cross a cut of 8 ft wide @ S E into a large Cypress Swamp, at
2460 ft on the East bank of the same Creek again, the line running
in it a cross cut hill of the West bank, and is crossed it at 2700 ft.

and at 2820, I made a half way mark on 2 beach trees, N 75 W
 one to S 30 W the other N 75 W, at 3090 I cross a lagoon 10 ft wide E
 East, at 3150 ft on west bank of said lagoon or lake and cross it & recross,
 at 3300 ft another 10 ft wide E & W, at 3700 ft cross a trail E to W,
 at 4380 ft cross a lake, or beaver pond, 30 ft wide E all about, near
 in thick woods, came to bridge, at 4420 ft on same lake 16 ft wide,
 crossed sundries times to 4730 ft, at this crossing found a line tree,
 a white oak 18 in. Di. N 75 W, it show to be a line running
 N to E, but could not find no line & continued, at 5120 ft entered &
 crossed a pond 70 ft wide, about, at 5200 ft another line
 tree & line running N to E, a magnolia 12 in. Di. N 75 W, and at
 5760 ft looked all around some distance, but no corner, made mark
 on 4 trees, one with an A, one with a B, and finally,
 no line and no corner ever was run, nor made for this lagoon on the East
 side, unless it should be in another corner
 from this point

The Jacob Buckman Survey all for beginning corner,
 at the most Eastern Corner of Andrew Moore's lagoon Survey, thence North
 1000 ft, made corner on the North bank of Big Sandy, with out crossing
 and giving the width & course of it, it is an error in the field notes,
 and should be South 1000 ft, on the West bank of said Creek,
 made the beginning corner &c, and it can not be otherwise, as the
 said Creek, is no less than 1000 ft from the E corner of said lagoon,
 and cross the South line where it show, or near about.

As I was to unwell, to Examine the Buckman Survey by being
 so much in water for several days, I will in few week go
 and measure the distance, between the N E or N W corner of
 said Survey, to the South line of School land N 7, and then West
 to the nearest corner, and will then send you the contents &c
