

Field notes of the Escobedo league as surveyed by me on the 19th 20th and 21st of January 1860 from a copy of the field notes certified by the commissioner of the land office

Beginning at the North ^{corner} of the Lowery J Hancock league a white oak 17 diameter bears South $1\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ West distant 72 varas marked X.

At the point South 47° East distant 8 varas the field notes called for a black oak 20 inches diameter. This was not found but upon examining the spot I found a slight cavity and in this decayed wood and decaying oak roots there was also portion of a decayed tree occupying such a position as to indicate its connection with the tree that ^{had} grown in ^{the} cavity.

Thence North 45° E along a marked line at 770 varas one of the Sandys 10 varas wide
At 2380 varas the other Sandy 15 wide
At 2547^m Mill creek

At 3425^m the road leading from Livingston to Woodville

At 3995^m the East corner of Colville
At 5000^m corner from which a black gum 18 inches diameter bears South $12\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ West distant $3\frac{7}{10}$ ~~varas~~ and a sweet gum 8 inches diameter bears South 81° West distant $4\frac{6}{10}$ varas this corner was made by me on an old marked ~~line~~ that does not continue beyond the corner

Thence North 45° W

At 985 varas a branch

At 1900 varas Mill creek

At 3320 the Mill road

At 5000 varas corner on an old line

a stake from from which a black gum 16 inches diameter bears N inches diameter and a pin oak 18 bears North 72 West distant $4\frac{8}{10}$ varas both marked X

Thence South 45 West

- at 280 varas a creek 7 varas wide
- At 455 one of the Sander 12 varas wide
- At one thousand and sixty five varas the North corner of the Colville league
- At 3780 varas the other Sander
- At 5000 varas comes a stake from which a black 18 inches diameter bears South 5° West distant 2 varas and a black 18 inches diameter bears North 75½ East distant $10\frac{6}{10}$ varas the latter is on an old line that appears to be 20 or 25 years old

Thence S. 45 E

- At 1260 a branch
- At 1660 varas Redding branch
- At 2690 varas Woodville road
- At 3930 varas rocky branch
- At 5000 varas the beginning corner
