Survey No. 1070 W.E.Mitchusson, and 854.4 H.I.Christmas. A Plat of the above and surrounding Surveys enclosed with Field Notes. In making the survey of these tracts I began my work at the S E corner of Survey No. 1037, T.C.R.R.Co;a rk ms fr wh the original bearing tree, a

L O now 30" in dia, and still green, brs N 25 E 27 vrs. From this original corner I ran a line West and at 1780 vrs found the S W corner of Survey No. 1037 and the S E corner of Survey No. 1038, fr wh the original Pin Oak bearing tree, now 10" in dia brs N 81 E 7 1/3 vrs, at 3274 vrs found a rk md on a high bluff, the original S W corner of Survey No. 1038 Fr and the S E corner No. 1043 at 5124 wrs found a rk md 3274 vrs found a rk md on a high bluff, the original S W corner of Survey No.1038 and the S E corner of Survey No. 1043, at 5174 vrs found a rk md at foot of mountain on East bank of a creek, the original S W corner of Survey No. 1043 and the S E corner of Survey No. 1066, and at 6574 vrs a rk md on N W side of top of mountain, the original S W corner of Survey No. 1066 and the N W corner of Survey No. 853t J.W.Cude. Field Notes to Survey No. 1067 call to begin at the S W corner of Survey No. 1066, but I find on the ground that Survey 1067 was actually begun at the S W corner of Survey No. 853t on N line of Survey No. 1070, W.E.Mitchusson. This fact was verified by re-surveying and finding the original corners with original bearing trees, of Survey No. 260, C.E.Felts, amd 361 Vanderpool, and then beginning at the S W corner of Survey No. 1067 near top of small mountain, on E line of Survey No. 260 and 70 vrs S 20 W from its N E corner and 1020 vrs S 20 W from the N E corner of Survey No. 261. Also found on the ground a rk md, the N W corner of Survey No. 854.5 abd a corner of Survey No. 1070. This rock mound, as indicated on the Plat, has at various times been used for the corner of 854 and 1070 in land transaction

at various times been used for the corner of 854 and 1070 in land transactions and is 477 vrs North from the N line of Survey No. 891. All rock mounds as indicated on the plat, or herein referred to, were found by me on the ground.

At the corners of Surveys No. 8502, 850.3 and 852.2 I found the original corners, with the original bearing trees, as indicated on the Plat and Field Notes.

On the ground, I could not find any evidence that the J.W. Cude Survey No.853t conflicted with Survey No. 1070, nor could , find any evidence that it had ever been surveyed on the ground South of Survey No. 1070.

In the Cude application for survey he states that the Survey should run West from the S E corner of Survey No. 1043 and with the South line of said Survey. At a spring I found wreckage of an old building said by Mr. H.I. Christmas and Mr. Will Kelley to be the remains of the J.W. Cude home. However, this building was located within Survey No. 1043, but just a short distance N W from its S E corner. Mr. Christmas and Mr. Kelley are both familiar with these surveys, each having lived on or near them for more than forty years.
