Explanation of attached Runnels Co. Rolled Sk. "C" 4/18/92
SKETCH, showing the position of surveys in Runnels County, hereon represented, as per connections by different Surveyors at different times.

THE BLACK LINES represent the surveys South of the Colorado River in Runnels County, as per calls in the fieldnotes, upon which patents issued for distance North & South, but show an excess, claimed to have been found on the ground by the different connections run, of 56 varas East & West from survey No. 412 to survey No. 400, and an excess of 50 varas in No. 400 & from No. 400 to No. 394 an excess in E. & W. of 40 varas each, and in No. 394 an excess of 55 varas E. & W.

THE YELLOW LINES represent connections from the S. E. corner of survey No. 166, Washington Co. R. R. Co., to the S. W. corner of survey No. 41, T. & N. O. R. R. Co. & continuing by different courses to the S. E. cor. of survey No. 393 & N. W. cor. of survey No. 394 on Colorado River, by C. E. Davis, Deputy Surveyor of Tom Green County.

THE RED LINES represent the connecting lines, from the original N. E. corner of survey No. 412 on Colorado River, to the N. W. corner of survey No. 93 1-2, and again, from the original N. W. cor. of survey No. 394 on the Colorado River to the S. E. cor. of survey No. 398, thence continuing to the N. E. corner of survey No. 398 & from said last named corner to the N. W. corner of said survey No. 93 1-2 by John D. Miller, Co. Surveyor of Runnels Co., as shown by certified sketch in Donation file No. 2719 now on file in this Office.

THE GREEN LINES, starting from the N. E. cor. of sur. No. 412 on the Colorado River, and running S. W. 3810 varas to a point on the E. boundary line of said survey No. 412, thence at right angles North-westwardly & North-eastwardly to a point represented as the N. W. cor. of No. 399 on the Colorado River, show the connecting line run by H. E. Dickinson, Ex-County Surveyor Runnels County, adopted by John D. Miller, County Surveyor of Runnels County, June 3rd. 1891, as shown by certified sketch in Donation file No. 2719, on file in this Office.

THE GREEN LINES, on the rear of the River surveys, show the position that would be given the back lines of the River surveys, by said Dickinson's connections.

I, W. L. McGaughey, Commissioner of the General Land Office of the State of Texas, do hereby certify that the above explanation is a correct description of the different connecting lines as represented on the sketch hereto attached and shown by data on file in this Office.

The Black lines represent the surveys south of the Colorado ^{River} in Runnels County, as per calls in the field notes, upon which patents issued for distance north and south, but show an excess, claimed to have been found on the ground by the different connections run, of 50 varas East and West from Survey No 412 to Survey No 400 - and an excess of 50 varas in No 400 and from No 400 to No 394 an excess in E & W of 40 varas each, and in 394 an excess of 55 varas E & W.

The Yellow lines represent connections from the S. E. Corner of Survey No 166
