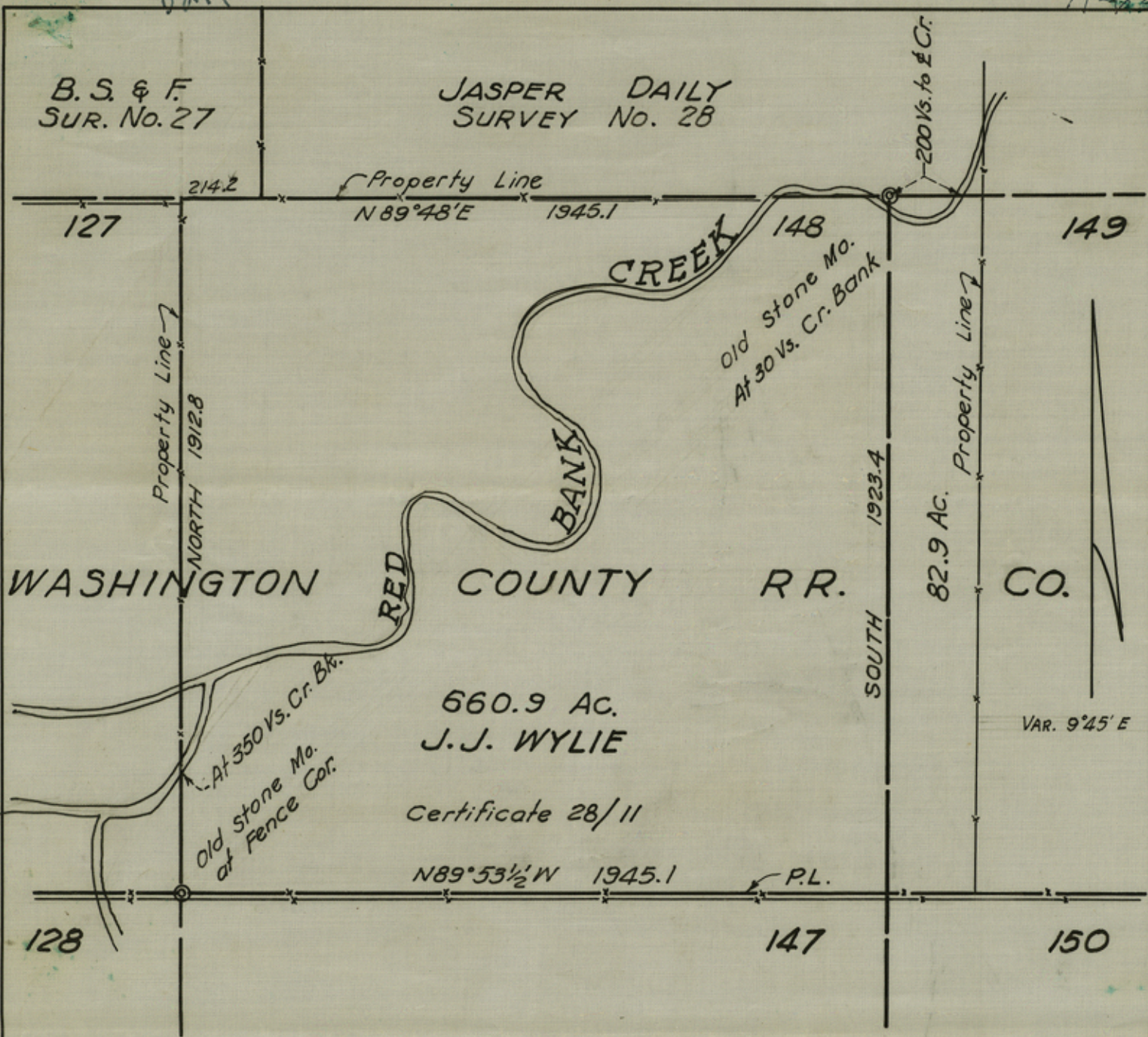

REPORT OF SURVEY OF J. J. WYLIE SURVEY NO. 148

This report covers the survey of the J. J. Wylie Survey No. 148, Washington County Railroad Company Block, Runnels County Texas.

In making this survey, I first found the scattered stone mound at the fence corner set for the Southwest corner of this survey in the North line of a county road. Upon chaining down the West fence line, I found the distance to the South bank of the creek to 350 varas as called for in the original field notes of Survey No. 127.

I then went to the Northwest corner and found the old fence corner. The ground South and West of the corner is in cultivation and the trees have been cleared out. I chained East along the North line and found the fence corner set for the Southeast corner of the B. S. & F. Survey No. 27 and the Southwest corner of the Jasper Daily Survey No. 28 to be 214.2 varas from the Northwest corner of this survey. This distance is within 1.8 varas of the distance called for in the original field notes for Survey No. 27.

I then went to the Northeast corner, and by chaining 200 varas West from where the North line of the block crosses a creek and 30 varas North of the bank of the creek, I found an old mound of stones which checks the above calls.

There was no fence on the East line, and I have constructed the East line parallel to the West line.

I set the South line to follow the North line of the county road. The road continues straight to the East and to the West.
