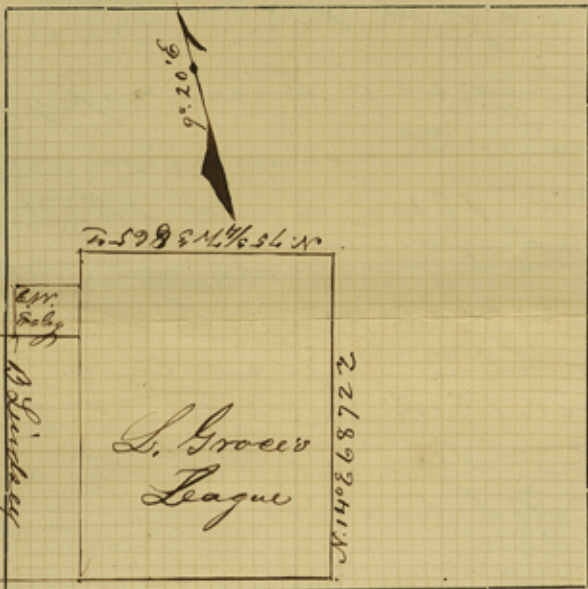

Beginning at at the South East corner

of Benjamin Lindsey's survey at a Post & Mound from which a Pine 18 In mar. B.L. brs N. 33° W 5' and a Pine 12 In dia, mark B.L. brs N. 29° E 1 1/2 Varas dist

Thence S 75° 1/4 E on an old line 1290 Red Oak 18 In line Tree mark L.G. 1780 Groce's Creek 2440 road to Hick man's 3100 an old line supposed to be the North line of Nelson's quarter of a League 3865 Varas found the old corner of this survey a Post and mound from which a Hickory 20 In dia Mar L.G. brs S. E. 4' and a Cypress 36 In brs S. 75° W. 7' dist

Thence N. 14° 15' E along the old line which I found to be N. 14° E at 3200 H. Lakman's road 4900 Griffins Creek course S.W. at 6872 Post & Mound the N.E. corner of this survey (the old bearing trees being down & partially consumed by fire) we took new bearings to wit a Red Oak 5 In mar L.G. bears N. 67° E 5' dist — Thence N. 75° 45' W along the old line at 160 Melloys Creek 1900 Hornbeam 10 In line tree & finding no further marks though we searched diligently, we made new marks at 1955 on crowd Groce's Creek at 2728 crossed Martins road Pine mar L.G. 3305 Martins Cr at 3865 finding no corner or old line, set a post in Mound near Jackson & Hudson's S. B. line, whence a Post Oak 8 In mar L.G. brs S 79° E. 6' & Red Oak 15 In brs N. 36° W 3/10 mar L.G. Thence S 14 1/2 W. at 1180 crossed Martins Creek 17032 intersected B Lindsey's N.B. line 35 Varas westerly from the place of the beginning.

earlier offset to said cor. Post & mound whence a Pine 24 In mar B.L. brs S 70° W. 17 3/10 & Pine 20 In mark B.L. S 40° E 18' Thence having recreated our line back with Lindsey's E. Bluffe S. 14° 15' W to the place of Beginning
