

Statement.

The surveyors sketch filed May 19/70 differs so much from the map in use in this office, that it appears impossible to make a satisfactory explanation.

(This is one of the many cases wherein the Commissioner should have the power, to send a surveyor of his appointment to the relative place to investigate the position of the questionable surveys on the ground and their true connection with the surroundings, as there is no law to compel a surveyor to investigate old surveys.)

On the old Map in office Williams League is connected with its S. W. corner to the S. E. corner of Bandrand's League and Haysletts League is connected with its N. E. corner 300 vs. S. E. from Bandrand's S. W. corn., which brings the S. line of the two first leagues in a straight line with the N. line of Haysletts survey by a course of N. 65 W. For the truth of this adopted location there is no prove in office as in the field notes of said League surveys is no connection given whatever, each one standing by itself. Later surveys connecting with said leagues brings the same in a different position from the above referred to, and which is represented on the new map in office ac=

cordingly. Now comes the last sketch of the surveyor filed May 19/70 and brings the connection of said leagues in a position, which differs widely from the representation of the old map as well as from the representation on the new map, and besides it appears that the representation on said sketch of some field notes are incorrect, as Williams S. line runs S. 65. W. without any offset as represented in said Sketch and which will bring S. Georgie's survey and all the other connecting with Williams S. line in a wrong position. — As to the field notes of H. S. Stapp —

said survey begins on the district line between Gonzales and Bartow dirs. at the S. E. corner of Stapp's survey, but as Allens N. E. line represent said division line it is evident that the call for it is wrong (see surveyor's sketch)

Now therefore it will be necessary to show which are the true connections between the three leagues and their true measures on the ground and which is the true connection of Clement Allen's survey with the league survey of said Hayeslate. July 23/70
