

... put the said Patrick McGloin into real + personal possession
of a league of land, in which survey there is included
a fraction of a labor in the bed of the river, contiguous to
the very town tract, which tract has been surveyed by the
surveyor William O Dechart, who was previously appointed
for the purpose, according to the following location and
boundaries: that of the league beginning on the shore of
the river, on the course North thirty degrees East 5332
varas were measured, where a stake was planted at the first
angle thereof. Thence North sixty degrees West 5000 varas
were measured, where another stake was planted for the
boundary marker. Thence another line, which contained 5432
varas, was run South 30 degrees West, where another stake
was set. Thence another line, which contained 1960 varas,
was run South 78 degrees East, where another stake was set,
and continuing South 31 degrees East 686 varas were measured,
where another stake was set, and continuing on the same
course 56 degrees East the last line, which contained 2537
varas, was run, until reaching the point at which the first
began. And passing thence to the lands designated for the
labor, from the upper part of that which the interested
party has pointed out, the first line, which contained 245
varas was run from South to North 25° East, which adjoins
vacant lands, and the second from East to West 48 degrees
North contained 512 varas, which bounded by vacant lands,
the third from North to South 25 degrees West contained 254,
and the fourth on the river from West to East 49 degrees
South contained 515 varas, which terminated where the first
began. These two parcels of land comprise a superficies of
a league, which is composed of one-twenty-fifth of arable
land, and the remainder of pasture land, which will serve
as a classification for the price which he must pay for it,
according to Article 22 of said law, under the penalties
established therein; and he is warned that within a year he
must construct permanent landmarks in each corner of the
tract, and that he must settle and cultivate it in conformity
with the provisions of the law. Therefore, exercising
