



Explanation of the above plat accompanying the field notes of the Jas. Taylor survey No. 687 and the Joseph Sawmire survey in Slane & San Saba counties.

Taking as a starting point the S.E. corner of survey No. 171 in the name of T. Bodaman this survey is partly in San Saba co. and one of the old colony surveys. We find the bearings of this corner standing and plainly marked. Thence W. 116° to the beginning corner of No. 623 in Slane co., this corner we can not find, but running W. stopping at a point 102 8 ns from beginning corner, and then running S. 62 1 ns. the length of the W. line of No. 623., we find the S. W. corner of 623 and the N. E. corner of No. 624, bearings standing and plainly marked. Then starting from this corner and running the courses and distances called for in the field notes of No. 624 we find all its corners. Then again starting from the N. E. cor. of No. 624 and running S. 212 ns, and 14 W. we find the N. E. cor. of No. 12; and then counter 36735

running from this corner the courses and distances called for in the field notes of No. 10, we find the distances correct and all the corners; and we find that No. 10 conflicts with surveys Nos 624, 625 & 626, as shown by the plat. We find all the old connecting corners of the Jas. Taylor No. 9 and it does not conflict with other surveys on the ground.

### Jas. Taylor. No 9

Beginning at the N.E. corner of survey No. 624 and S.W. cor. of 623, and running N. 62° we strike the S. line of No. 170, 185 vs W. of its S.E. corner. We find the N.E.S. line of No. 623 to be 1028 vs instead of 1453 vs as called for in its field notes or 426 vs short. There running N. 263° vs, N. 1100 vs & N. 1800 vs we find a corner of the J. White survey in San Saba co., established by W. S. Hayes present co. sur. of S. S. county. (we refer you to the field notes of the J. White surv.) and 100 vs further W. we find the S.W. corner of No. 9 S. 2 M. established by J. H. Snellings ex co.sur. of S. S. co. (and we refer you to the field notes of the I.R.R. Co. No 1 in S. S. co.)

There S. 78° vs and 1030 vs west we find the old established corner of No. 574, a few vs. N. of this corner we find the S.E. corner of the I.R.R. Co. No. 1 made by J. H. Snellings. There S. 45° W. 950 vs and 869 vs S. 45° E. we find the C. corner of No. 578, bearing standing. There, ~~S. 43°~~ vs E. and 657 vs S. we find the N.B.S. of No. 12 and 146 vs W. from this point we find the N.W. corner of No. 12, bearing standing. There E. from the N.W. corner of No. 12, 1215 vs we find the N.E. corner of No. 118 the extreme N.W. corner of No. 9. plainly marked. (this line is too short)

There E. 40 vs we find the W. N. E. corner of No. 9. (plainly marked) Then running E. from this corner 1248 vs. we find the E. N. W. corner of No. 9. (plainly marked,) this line is 248 vs too great according to the field notes of No. 9. Instead of No. 626 being cut out of No. 9 as represented by the field notes of No. 9, it conflicts with No. 10 as shown by the plat.

We can not locate No. 3 H&T.C.R.R. co., exactly, we find the S. corner all right, but when we run the W. line N. we find the W. line the distance stops about 225 as S. of the S.W. line of No. 578, and will not touch the S.W. line of No. 577, as it calls for, but we find no corner as described in the field notes; and we further find that the field notes of No. 3 describes the N. corner of No. 577 instead of the E. corner of No. 577, which has no bearing trees. We can not find the N.E. corner of No. 3. on the ground. The surveying of these H&T.C.R.R. Co. surveys has been poorly done.

### Joseph Lawrence survey.

This survey does not conflict with the two Forehand premissions on the ground; and neither does it conflict with No. 4 H&T.C.R.R. Co. survey, on the ground, as we find that all the E.O. corners of surveys No. 418, No. 4, No. 580 and 581, to be on one and the same line on the ground, as shown by the file #.
