Mesers. Walters & baker, San Saba, Texas. Gentlemen:

This office is in receipt of your letters of the 13th and 23rd instants, both in reference to the construction or position of the lines of certain surveys shown on the map of San Saba County recently compiled by this office, and desiring an explanation of such construction.

In reply beg to say that in compiling the new map of San Saba County, in addition to the original field notes and plats of surveys on file in this office, corrected field notes, certified plats and statements, judgments of courts and field notes and plats of late surveys made under the Scrap Act, were all taken into consideration. According to some of these certified plats, a number of corners are shown to be as much as one-half mile cut of position. Such condition renders it very difficult, if not impossible, to construct a map and show all lines of surveys to run, as called for, in their field notes; hence, in many places where surveys called to have common Sorners with, perhaps, the same sitness trees, the lines would have to be run on an angle to prevent breaking such corners.

In regard to the division line between surveys numbers 398 in the name of H. Deichman and Ho. 400, H. A. Longwell, referred to, will say that there is considerable trouble and uncertainty in the location of surveys at this point. According to a certified plat by S. M. Moore, dated Cotober 14, 1891, a resurvey of the MatcRYGO. 1 nds North of the San Saba riverm a connecting line was run from the SE corner of survey No. 12, Elizabeth Friley, on the North bank of river northward to the W corner of survey Hc. 87, MatcRYGO., which is a common corner with surveys numbers 1 and 88 of same grantee and 447, J. Lontz, showing a conflict of 405 waras N. and S. between said surveys numbers 87 and 86, and the North part of Mo. 12, Elizabeth Friley. This plat does not show surveys numbers 398, 399, 400 and 405, but shows surveys numbers 401, 402, 403 and 404 to lia one mile due West of No. 88; in other words, the ME corner of Mo. 404 is shown to be one mile due West from the NW corner of No. 88.

## #2. Walters & Baker.

A report by J. J. Long, county surveyor, filed in this office March 30, 1904, in connection with the vacancy North of No. 13, G. W. Thatcher, states that actual measurement from the San Saba river North, does not reach the SE corner of the H. Gramm survey Do. 399, by 230 varas. This statement and field notes of vacancy North of No. 13 moving No. 399 northward was followed in the construction of the map. The NE corner of No. 398 and SE corner of No. 400 being common with the NW corner of No. 399, describing same witness trees, also the NW corner of No. 398, SW corner of No. 400 and SE corner of No. 401, call to be cormon, these surveys cannot be separated at these corners; therefore, if the surveyor is correct in find-ing survey No. 399 53 230 waras North of where it was supposed to be, unless there is a shortage in that survey N. and S., the NE corner of survey No. 398 and SE corner of No. 400 likewise moves North. Therefore, to connect this corner thus fixed to the SE corner of No. 401 as shown by Moore's each, requires a diagonal line as shown by map.

It is possible that the SE corner of survey No. 13, Elizabeth Friley, is further South than its field notes place it; and if so, there may be ample room for these surveys without shoving them North as indicated by said surveyor's report; however, there is no data here showing such fact.

In regard to the chape and lines of the C. Dauer survey No. 140 and other surveys in same tier South, situated in the SW part of San Saba County, referred to, will say that the nE corner of said No. 140 calls to be common with the SW corner of survey No. 141 and its NW corner common with the SE corner of survey No. 145, describing identical witness trees. You will note that a scrap survey S.F. 9203, in the name of W. E. Campbell, has been admitted North of surveys numbers 143 and 144, Johanna Sommers; also another scrap survey in name of J. E. Kuykendall admitted South of numbers 141 and 142, the effect of which moved or shifted the surveys in tier East of survey No. 140, South of their supposed original position.

## #3. Walters & Baker.

A sketch made by J. G. Dismukes, filed in this office February 13, 1908, in connection with the above mentioned scrap surveys, shows the North line of survey No. 120, Augustus Dauer, to be common with the South line of survey ho. 21, Seale & Morris, just as shown on the new maps of San Saba County. The SE corner of survey No.139, C. Dauer, calls to be common with the NW corner of said Ho. 120. There appears to be no disturbance in the tier of surveys N. and S. West of survey No. 140; therefore, to connect the corner of surveys in the tier South of No. 140 with the corners of surveys in the adjoining tiers East and West of same, requires diagonal lines as shown by map.

If this construction is not in accordance with the facts on the ground. I will be pleased to correct the map at this or any other point upon being furnished with a certified plat and statement by the county surveyor showing the true location of surveys, etc.
