Dear Sir:-

I am about through with the preliminary work on Block D. and will go to sectionizing it - at once I run a preliminary line through the centre of the block each way after getting the outside lines and I am glad to say that the departures from the Chalk & Hall work will not be great. In fact, in many places there will be but little change. The lines will in some instances cross and recross the Chalk work in crossing the block. I am satisfied that there will be but little dissatisfaction on the part of the settlers when they see that the changes are not great. As fast as I reach the settlers and they can see for themselves the extent of the change they have

so far expressed themselves  
as satisfied and to my certain  
knowledge opposition is subsiding  
and I think all that is necessary  
to do is to go ahead with the work  
and I feel quite sure that in  
the end all will be well.

I am sorry that Mr. Terrell did  
not find my camp when he was  
out. I was on a rapid retreat  
up the line of block and was on  
the move all the time. I am  
proceeding with this work, sparing  
no work and using the utmost diligence  
and caution, so as to be sure of  
my way and in the end I believe all  
will be satisfied and the work will  
be of great benefit to the people on  
the block.
