

Beginning in the elbow known as Kuechlers or Elbow Lake at the intersection of West and East prong, or Couchs and Lane forks of East fork of Devils river as identified and pointed out to me October 27th 1885 by Jacob Kuechler in presence of John W^c Bean, Sam^l & Locke, E. W^c Millan and R. Holland, said Jacob Kuechler as deputy surveyor of Boxer District on Nov. 10th 1877 surveyed survey no. 3 Tusk Transportation Co. by Cert. No 106 on which said lake is situated.

October 1st 1898. Resurvey of the above mentioned survey no. 3. Variation $9^{\circ}30'$ East. Beginning at the foot of bluff or bank about 8 or 10 feet high at the intersection of said forks; Thence $S45^{\circ}W$ at 920 vrs cross one prong ^{or cutoff} of East fork, at 950 vrs. a point, drove a stake for S.W. corner of said sur. no. 3, 35 vrs. West of a cut off of East fork and 23 vrs. East of old fence post being S.W. corner of a destroyed wire fence, several fence posts are still standing on a line running North and East from said corner post, said stake being also distant 25 vrs. $S28\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}E$ from an old rock mound. Begun at our point a stake, Thence East on South line of survey no. 3 & North line of sur. no. 31 at 35 vrs. cross one prong or arm of East fork, at 120 vrs. cross old road course N. E & S.W. at 200 vrs. cross drain c. S.W. at 350 vrs cross lower end of a tank in a small draw, at 660 vrs. cross draw course N.W. at 960 vrs. cross large road, valley to South,

at 1800 vrs. top of high ridge, 1900 vrs. to an old rock mound on East side of foot hill for S.E. corner of survey no. 3 & N.E. corner of sur. no. 31.

Thence North on East line of sur. no. 3 at 240 vrs. top of ridge, a point from which Words wind mill bears $N 11\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} W$, at 550 vrs. foot of hill, at 684 vrs. cross road course $E \& W$, at 800 vrs. cross water hole in a slough an arm of South prong of Llano fork, at 1206 vrs. cross a dirt road, at 1250 vrs. cross another slough or arm of South or Llano prong of East fork of Devils river, at 1900 vrs. to an old rock mound two feet high on slope of hill, for the N.E. corner of survey no. 3 from said rock mid. a double or forked Live Oak each abt. 12 inches in diameter, and each being forked, one is marked \times vrs. $N 22\frac{1}{2}^{\circ} W$ 31 vrs. marks appear to be about fifteen or more years old, another double L.O. each about 10 inches in diameter and distant $1\frac{1}{2}$ vrs. S.W. from the first above marked L.O. all comprising a group of four trees, Words Wind mill bears $N 20^{\circ} W$ from said rock mound.

Thence West at 198 vrs. cross old road to Fort Concho, now called the Sonora and Junco road, at 660 vrs. a point on line from which Words wind mill bears $N 3^{\circ} W$, at 970 vrs. center of Concho draw or main prong of East fork of Devils river at 1900 varas to an old stone monument about three feet high for the N.W. corner of said survey no. 3 nearly

on the summit of high rocky ridge, about
30 yrs. from the top of said ridge.
Thence South coursed said West line to S.W. corner
the place of beginning.

Began at the S.W. cor. of said no. 3, thence
North on its West bdy. line at 380 yrs. cross
main channel of said East fork of Devils
river course $S 58^{\circ} W$, bed 20 yrs wide, from
this point $N 58^{\circ} E$ 110 yrs a prong or cut off
course S. of West crossing the South line 35 yrs.
East of its S.W. corner (see sketch) It is
evident from the above fieldnotes that
survey no. 3 Rusk Transportation Co. has
been fully identified on the ground by
having found all four of its corners well
established.

Beginning at the S.W. cor. of sur. no. 3 & S.E.
corner of sur. no. 4 Rusk Transportation Co.
Thence West on the South line of no. 4 at 1060 yrs.
cross one prong of East fork of Devils river
course South of West down the valley, (see map)
The above was surveyed by C.A. Kuechler
and Ernst von Rosenberg and in part by
William Ziller as flagman October
1 and 2nd 1898 in Sutton County Texas.

October 2nd and part of 3rd 1898, Sutton County Texas.

Returning to the S. E. corner of sur. no. 3 old rock mound on East side of foot hill, being also the N. E. corner of no. 31 and N. W. cor. of sur. # 33 Tyler Tap R. R. Co. Thence East at 360 vrs. cross draw C. N. W. at 880 vrs. over North point of hill, at 1215 vrs. cross draw C. W of N. at 1900 varas a point for corner in valley, side of small Mesquite tree in a cat claw bush for S. E. corner of # 35 & N. E. cor. # 33 & N. W. corner of # 37.

Thence South with East line of sur. # 33 at 469 vrs. cross a draw C. N. E. into Llano fork of East fork of Devils river.

Returning to point in cat claw bush for S. E. cor. # 35 & N. E. cor. # 33 & N. W. cor. # 37.

Thence North over ridge at 515 vrs. cross old sheep (brush) pen, at 727 vrs. cross road course E & W, leading up Llano prong of East fork, at 950 vrs. cross Llano prong, at a water hole, at 1900 varas a point for N. E. corner of # 35 on a high ridge overlooking large valley to the North East and S. E. and large valley S. W. Thence West coursed the North line of sur. # 35 to a rock mid. the North East corner of sur. no. 3 and North West corner of survey no. 35 (see map) the above was surveyed by C. A. Kuebler and Ernst von Roubenz & William Ziller flagman.
