Dear Sir:

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As Transitman I herewith submit a report of a connecting line run by me in Val Verde and Sutton Counties from December 3 to December 18, 1936 for Mrs. Bertha Glasscock. The purpose of which was to locate surveys Nos. 36, 38, 24, and 36 1/2 in Southwest Sutton County.

I began at the NE corner of Survey No. 1, Val Verde County, Certificate No. 1897 issued to C. C. S. D. & R. G. N. G. RR Co., and surveyed by Wm. Cassin October 31, 1880.

This point is a large live oak post in a SE corner of fence from which a dead live oak about 7 inches in diameter marked "A" bears South 205 varas; a grove of large live oaks around a water hole in Buckley's Creek bears S 63° 30' E about 350 varas. This post appears to have been set in the old mound.

From the above described point I ran West (Variation 10° 30' East) 1970 varas to enother large live oak post about 16 inches in diameter and marked "X" in the NW corner of net fence from which a live oak stump (partly burned) with rocks placed around it bears S 11° E 102 varas.

Thence North 1999 varas pass stone mound marked "NE 9".

Thence North 1946 varas pass stone mound marked "NW 11".

Thence North 1946 varas pass stone mound marked "NW 16".

Thence North 1955 varas pass stone mound marked "NW 19".

Thence North 1941 varas pass stone mound marked "NW 22" in drain. This mound is called original by Mr. E. C. Saunders, County Surveyor of Sutton County, Texas, but has the appearance of having been washed and piled up by flood waters and I do not believe it to be original. I have therefore established the point for this corner by projecting the North lines of Surveys Nos. 21 and 22 West to intersect my line from the South, making the total distance from stone mound marked "NW 19" North 1951 varas.

Thence North 1900 varas to a point for the NE corner of Survey No. 36. Mr. Bonnell, the original locator of this survey calls for stone mound from which another stone mound 4 feet high bears N 52° 30' W 1350 varas; a live oak 5 inches in diameter marked "X" bears N 49° W 1320 varas; a cedar marked "X" bears N 51° W 1290 varas. Trees in small valley running North into East fork of Devil's River. I ran N 52° 30' W 1350 varas, but could not find stone mound or trees that Mr. Bonnell calls for, however we did land in a small valley running about N 20° W into Sonora Draw. Evidently at that time Mr. Bonnell was calling the Sonora Draw the East fork of Devil's River. With

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this in mind we searched a radius of about 700 varas around our point located from our NE 36, but were unable to locate the mound or trees called for.

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I returned to my point 1350 varas N 52° 30' W from my point previscualy located for NE 36. By taking the latitude and departure of Mr. Bonnell's calls for his witnesses from NE 36, NE 37, NE 38, NE 39, and NW 40. I find that he should have a row of stone mounds 1900 varas spart and about 560 varas North and parallel to the North line of these surveys. With this in mind I ran West searching for these mounds and trees. I spent about four days searching for them but was unable to find any of the mounds or trees.

I returned to the point at end of my line from the South, the NE 36, and ran West. At 3112.7 varas pass 309.3 varas South of a stone mound set by John McNicol for the SE corner of Survey No. 3 from which a live oak 16 inches in diameter bears S 16° 30' E 3.5 varas; \overline{x} on fixed rock bears N 39° 30' E 19.5 varas.

Thence West 3216.6 varas to a point 300 varas South of an old stone mound from which a live oak 10 inches in diameter bears N 88° 45' E 86 varas.

I then ran West 6430 varas and North 617 varas to an old stone mound, the original corner of Survey No. 17, Block G, G.W.T.& P.RR Co., to check the position of the NW corner of Survey No. 36 1/2 in name of D. F. Story.

Beginning at the NW corner of Survey No. 18.

Thence West 1947 varas stone mound.

Thence West 1970 varas stone mound.

Thence West 1931 varas stone mound.

Thence West 1931 varas stone mound.

Thence West 1960 varas stone mound.

These stone mounds were set by Mr. W. T. Hope, at that time County Surveyor of Val Verde County, and they are in correct relation with the original corners in Block A, C.& M. RR Co., which is South of these surveys.
