Lines run from NW Co. No 32 B.B.B+C.R.R Co. North of Paint Creek. South and East to the SW corner of 99 East Texas RR Co. Lines run as above to keep on level ground so that measurement would be correct.

To give room for the Antonin Fernandez Survey the distance South between these corners should be 24945 yrs. it is only 23601 yrs. making the Brooks & Burleson Surveys Nos 10, 11, 12, 18, 19 & 20. Conflict with East Texas RR Co's 799 yrs. The distance East between said corners should be 7917 yrs. it is only 67 yrs. making the Brooks & Burleson Survey No 13 on the East Conflict 733 yrs with the East Texas RR Co's.

And a jury being waived, the matters in controversy, as well of fact as of law, were submitted to the court, and the court having heard the evidence and argument of counsel, is of opinion that the law and the facts are with the defendants, and that Veteran Donation Warrant No. 1194, issued to said Antonio Fernandez by the Commissioner of the General Land Office, Nov. 21, 1885, was located upon elder patented surveys, which are the property of the defendants, the Monroe Cattle Company and The Reynolds Land and Cattle Company, to-wit: Surveys No. 17, 18, 11, 10, 19 and 20, granted to Brooks & Burleson by the State of Texas. Also section No. 1, granted to Adams, Beatty & Moulton by the State of Texas. And also section numbers 230, 229, 100, 101, 128, 127, 156, of the lands granted to the Eastern Texas Railroad Company. All of which are elder titled surveys and cover the land described in said patent, and are the property of the defendants.

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It is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed by the court that the defendants The Monroe Cattle Company and The Reynolds Land and Cattle Company do have and recover of and from the plaintiffs The Leon & H. Blum Land Company, all the land described and included in the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at the N. E. corner of section No. 101, E. T. R. R. Co., stone mound, for S. E. corner of this survey. Thence North 5500 varas, the north west corner of survey No. 1, Adams, Beatty & Moulton, Block X. Thence west 317 varas, to the line of survey No. 20, Brooks & Burleson. Thence south 4985 varas, for south east corner of survey No. 10, Brooks & Burleson, a stone mound. Thence west at 6819 varas, bed of Clear Fork, 7599 varas, the easterly north east corner of No. 16, Brooks & Burleson, a stone mound. Thence south 515 varas, to north line of section No. 156, E. T. R. R. Co. Thence east 759 varas, bed of Clear fork, 7916 varas to the beginning.

And it is further ordered, adjudged and decreed that the patent heretofore issued by the State of Texas to Hyman Blum, Assignee of Antonio Fernandez, by virtue of said certificate on the 24th day of December A.D. 1887, No. 542, Vol. 6, be delivered up and the same is hereby canceled, set aside and held for naught, and the Commissioner of the General Land Office of the State of Texas is hereby directed to cancel the same on the records of his office.

It is further ordered that the defendants pay the sum of fifty dollars of the costs incurred, for which the plaintiffs shall have their execution.

And it is further ordered that the defendants do have and recover of the plaintiffs all the remainder of the costs in said

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
case, except said sum of fifty dollars, and that the defendants have their execution therefor. And that execution issue in favor of the Officers of Court, against each party respectively, for all the costs in this behalf incurred. And that each of said parties are hereby permitted to withdraw their title papers, including the surveyors report, from the file papers in this cause.


And it appearing to the court that the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars is reasonable compensation for the labor necessary to make the survey and report heretofore ordered by this court, it is ordered that such sum of one hundred and fifty dollars be and the same is hereby allowed H. M. Henderson the surveyor appointed as aforesaid, for his said services, and that said sum be taxed as costs in this case.

I The undersigned appointed by your Honor to determine by actual survey if there had been a vacancy between the Brooks & Burleson Survey on the North and West and the East Texas R.R. Survey on the South and East, upon which the Antonio Fernandez Survey, the land claimed by Pftt was located. Begs leave to report, that after careful survey he found no such vacancy had existed. Instead thereof he found said Brooks and Burleson Survey in conflict 799 acres on the South and 733 acres on the East with said East Texas R.R. Survey. He furthermore reports that he found said Fernandez Survey was located in conflict with said East Texas R.R. Survey to the extent of 106 acres on the South and 149 acres on the East sides of same. Said conflict having been caused by the County Surveyor of Shackelford County, when making said Fernandez Sur. mistaking the S.W. cor of No 99. East Texas R.R. Sur. The point taken by him for said corner is 183 acres S $\frac{1}{2}$  E of true corner of same. He measured forth

shows said B.B. & C.R.R. the Adams, Beatty and  
Moulton, Brooks & Bullock & East Texas R.R.  
surveys also in red ink shows. Tuesday  
sur correctly, also County lines which I  
connected on to at mile corner 3 miles  
north of S.W. corner of Throckmorton Co.  
By mistake I represent Park creek too  
near corner of 30 & 31. B.B. & C. Sure it  
should be about 300 or further West.  
The Clear fork as represented is taken  
from another sketch, as I did not pre-  
tend to meander it. But from where I  
crossed it and saw its course I think  
it is correctly shown.

I hereby certify that the above sketch correctly represents the position on the ground of the surveys shown thereon, as found by careful measurement from N.W. Co. 32 B.B.B.R.R. Co. to S.W. cor. of Survey #99 H.H. Henderson.

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3800 or from said false corner & established  
point as NW cor of  $\text{N}^{\circ} 100$  E. T. R.R. Sur 18<sup>o</sup> or begin-  
ning corner of said Fernandez Sur, thereby putting  
it in conflict as above stated. The balance  
of said Fernandez Sur is located on top of  
and in conflict with  $\text{S}^{\circ} 10, 11, 17, 18, 19 + 20$  Brooks  
and Burleson Surveys.

In making said Survey I began at the NW cor  
of Survey  $\text{S}^{\circ} 32$ . B. B. B. & G. R.R. Co. on North side  
of Paint Creek near the West line of Rockwall  
County. I failed to find bearing trees as  
called for at any corner, but so much of  
the old Mesquite timber has been burned  
out as to give little chance of finding  
trees marked so long ago. The point from  
which I ran is marked by an old stone in  
which I believe to be the original NW cor of  
said Sur  $\text{S}^{\circ} 32$ . Paint Creek a large stream  
at this place, with marked and peculiar  
bends, fits the Survey as called for in  
field notes of the B. B. B. & G. R.R. Sur. Partic-  
ularly the Bluff on East bank of Paint Creek  
on which the corner of  $\text{S}^{\circ} 30 + 31$  causes to be,  
and the narrow marked bend 2 miles  
East of it - in which the corner of Sur  
 $\text{S}^{\circ} 32, 33, 58 + 56$ . B. B. B. & G. R.R. Co. call to  
be. There is no other place on this bank  
and no other bend there which can so fit the Sur.  
The corner of 32 from which I ran could  
be moved 300 or 300 on North and 300 on West

and still conform to creek calls. But it cannot be moved further North or West without taking corner of 32. 33. 55. & 56. out of bend called for. no further West and putting corner of 30 & 31. West of Bluff on which they call to corner.

If moved further North and West the Survey would entirely miss the Creek which as represented in accompanying books West about 300 rods North of corner. To move these Survey to the furthest point North and West would not effect the result of this suit, as it would still leave the Brooks & Burleson Sur 499 rods in conflict on the South and 383 rods on the East.

Assuming said stone mounted from which I drew to be the true corner of N=32. for after long and careful search I could find no other, I drew first South and West and then South and East as shown by balance sheet hereto attached marked Exhibit A. the directions of my lines being determined by the smoothest ground, so that measurement would be as near correct as possible.

I measured with a 20 varar steel tape (measured and carried by myself) carefully leveled and held tight, and not one varar allowed or thrown in, as is usual by Surveyors. So that if measured in the

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usual manner the conflict between the  
Brooks & Burleson & East Texas RR Survs  
would be 100 to 200 yards more than I  
make it.

The Adams, Beatty & Moulton begin on the B.B.  
B&G.R.R. South line, and the Brooks & Burleson  
Surveys begin on the A.B.M. line: and course  
and distance from the B.B. B&G.R.R. line  
control their position, as they were  
platted or Office Surveys, not calling  
for stream crossings or bearing trees.

The SW cor of 99. East Texas R.R. sur. calls for  
a stone m<sup>a</sup> at head of a branch from  
which a long mound bears N 45° E 2000 or  
I found old stone m<sup>a</sup> at head of a branch  
from which S<sup>o</sup> m<sup>a</sup> bears as called for -  
The S.E. cor of 99. calls for stone m<sup>a</sup> in  
side of round mound. I ran East 1900  
or so, found it as called for, so that no question  
can arise as to this corner.

The stone m<sup>a</sup> with stone in it marked NW 98  
put up by same one as SW cor 99 or NE cor 98,  
(and which Mr. Earhart accepted as such) and ran  
3800 or so North from to establish NW cor of  
NE 100 & beginning of S.E. corner of Fernando  
Survey, is 183 or so S 54 1/2 ° E. from said true  
corner & from it said long mound  
bears N 45° E. & 1900 or so East from it would  
up round mound on side of which SE cor  
of 99 is.
