Throckmorton County I, A. W. Butler Surveyor of Throckmorton
County do hereby certify that, in surveying the
lines of the Comanche Indian Reserve in Throckmorton
County - making the S. Corner, on the west bank of the
Clear Fork of the Brazos River, at the N.E. corner of the
John Carr Survey, at a Pecan tree, with old mark
(cannot what the mark represents),

Running thence N 70° E as called for in orig
field notes, - at the ~~edge~~ edge of the valley of
the Clear Fork pass just south of a spring
at about the distance ^{from the river as} represented in the sketch
accompanying the orig field notes - I find no
evidence of a corner, until I reach the fourth
call, two miles from the river, when there
is a large pile of stones, there are no oak
bearing trees as called for, but an oak tree
near by - and none others that I saw in the
vicinity, which leads me to think that there
were once trees as called for, and have disap-
peared,

Thence in the same direction 1/2 mile to large
pile of stones on hill in grove of Gum elastic
trees (none marked) - Thence in the same
direction 1/2 mile to pile of stones in prairie

Thence in the same direction 1/2 mile to pile
of stones

Thence in the same direction 1/2 mile to
mesquit grove, find no evidence of corner,

Thence N 20° E 1/2 mile pile of stones
in ravine near branch,

Thence in the same direction to cross branch

at about 60 ms, - 1/2 mile - no corner,

Thence in the same direction S, M, and I find all the rock-piles called for in this line - I also found on the East line of the Reserve, every rock pile as called for in orig field notes, also crossed East Tecumseh Creek within one chain of the place called for crossing Sibley Creek - Though this line does not run in the direction called for, but at about N 17 W, instead of N 20 W -

Beginning at the N.E. Corner of the Reserve, - a large stone pile - Thence S 74 W 965 ms large pile of stones,

Thence S 73 1/4 W 950 ms find no corner. Thence in same direction, 950 ms to small earth mound in valley of West Tecumseh Creek -

Thence in the same direction - crossing Tecumseh Creek 950 ms to rock-pile on side of hill -

Thence in about the same direction I find every S, M, as called for in orig f. n., and Cross Ranger Creek at precisely the distance called for, in orig f. n., at crossing "Spring Brook"

This the North line of the Reserve does not run as called for, (S 70 W) but at from S 73 W to S 74 W, which will throw the N.E. Corner of the Res., about 700 or 800 ms north of where it would be if run as called for. All rock-piles have the appearance of being quite old.

I found a number of marked trees along the lines,

The meanders of the Clear Fork of the Brazos River from the beginning corner, on the Joe Carr sur, to the S. C. on the Hardin sur, ~~etc~~ are not as described in orig field notes, and the distance is nearly 9000 ft greater (North & South) than called for in orig field notes.
