Comanche Reserve.

Field notes of a survey made by direc-
tion of the Departments of War and the
Interior for the benefit of Indians living
within the limits of the State of Texas, in
accordance with an act of the Legislature
of said State approved Feby 6th 1854.

This tract of land contains four Spanish
leagues or (177 1/2) acres, is situated upon
the Clear Fork of the Brazos River above the
road leading from Fort Belknap to Fort
Phantom Hill and below the confluence of
Paint Creek.

Beginning at a Pecan tree marked "D" situated upon the south western bank of the clear Fork of the Brazos River, and bearing south $(5\frac{1}{2}^{\circ})$ East, and distant 360 yards, from the northeast corner of a survey made the 16th day of August, 1853 by Neil McLeenan deputy Surveyor of Milam District for John Carr by his assignee J. H. Isbell, by virtue of donation certificate number (439) dated 12th of May 1852, and running South $70^{\circ} 20' W.$ (40) chains to a mound of earth upon the prairie in the valley; Thence $80^{\circ} 20' W.$ for (40) chains to another mound of earth upon the prairie in the valley. Thence in the same direction (40) chains to a mound of earth in a ravine. Thence in the same direction (40) chains to a mound of rocks with three oak trees blazed and distant from the mound 15, 32, and 33, feet, respectively. Thence in the same direction (40) chains to a mound of rocks upon a hill with a gum elastic tree (blazed) standing 15 feet to the south. Thence in the same direction 37.¹⁴_{882⁴} chains to a point from which a mesquite tree stands at a distance of 33 feet, perpen dicularly to the right. Thence 2.^{67⁹}₈₆ chains to a mound of rocks standing upon the prairie at 1.31 chains from a mesquite tree, which is N. $49^{\circ} W.$ Thence in the same direction 12.^{50⁷⁷}₈₇ chains to a mesquite tree which

stands three feet perpendicular to the right of the line. thence $27^{65\frac{3}{4}}$ chains to a mound of rocks.

Thence in the same direction $40^{\frac{1}{4}}$ chains to a mound of earth in a mesquite grove with a mesquite tree blazed, bearing S. 43° W. distant 50 links and marked with the letters I.R. This mound stands upon the South West corner of the reservation.

From thence the line runs North $19^{\circ} 40' \text{ West}$, for 28.18 chains to an oak tree blazed, and standing three feet east of the line.

Thence in the same direction $11^{88\frac{1}{4}}$ to a mound of rocks in a ravine near a spring brook. Thence in the same direction $1.75^{41\frac{1}{4}}$ chains the line crosses the brook and runs $26^{62\frac{3}{4}}$ chains to a mesquite tree blazed, and standing 73 links to the left of the line. Thence $11.75^{10\frac{3}{4}}$ chains in the same direction to a mound of earth.

Thence in the same direction $27^{65\frac{3}{4}}$ chains to a mesquite tree blazed, standing 42 feet to the left of the line. Thence $12^{27\frac{1}{4}}$ chains in the same direction to a mound of rocks with a mesquite tree bearing N. 38° W. distant one chain.

Thence $23^{54\frac{1}{4}}$ chains in the same direction to a blazed mesquite tree, three feet to the left of the line. Thence in the same direction, $17^{80\frac{3}{4}}$ chains to a mound of rocks with a mesquite tree bearing N. 58° W. distant 50 links. Thence in the same direction

24.13 Chains to a blazed mesquite tree standing on the line. Hence 15.87 chains to a mound of rocks in a mesquite grove. Hence in the same direction 17.21 chains to a mesquite tree 6 feet. to the left. of the line.

Hence in the same direction 22.79 chains to a mound. of rocks in a ravine. Hence in the same direction 15.26 chains to a mesquite tree two feet to the right of the line. Hence in the same direction 24.74 chains to a mound. of rocks in the valley of the Clear Fork.

Hence in the same direction 9.89 chains to an elm tree standing in a ravine. Hence in the same direction 11 chains to a stake in the ravine from which a large Pecan tree. blazed & bears S38°W and is distant five feet. The line then turns to S70°20'W. and runs 40 chains to a mound. of earth in a grove of mesquite trees. It then turns to N. 19°40'W. and runs 40 chains to a mound of earth in the prairie.

Hence in the same direction 6.26 chains to a large mound of earth in the valley of the Clear Fork, which mound is upon N. West corner of the reserve. In the centre of the mound is a large stake marked with the letters I.R. From thence the line turns to N. 70°20' East. and runs 520.60 chains in this direction crossing the Clear Fork three times.

The trees along this line are blazed distinctly and the line can be traced without difficulty. At the eastern extremity or the north eastern cor of the reservation there is a large mound of rocks and a mesquite tree bearing N. 33° E. distant 60 links. The tree is marked with the letters I.R.

The line then turns south $19^{\circ} 40' E.$ and runs 17.66 chains to a mound of earth in the valley of "Sibley's" Creek.

Thence in the same direction 19 chains where it crosses one branch of "Sibley's" Creek.

Thence in the same direction 21 chains to a mound of rocks with a mesquite tree (blazed) bearing S. 20° E distant 40 links.

Thence in the same direction 40 chains to a mound of earth with a mesquite tree (blazed) bearing S. 55° W. and distant 40 links.

Thence in the same direction 40 chains to a mound of earth with a mesquite tree (blazed) bearing West. distant 70 links. Thence in the same direction 40 chains to a mound of earth in the valley of a creek with a clump of Willows, bearing West. distant 40 links.

Thence in the same direction 40 chains to a mound of earth.

Thence in the same direction 40 chains to a mound of earth.

Thence in the same direction 40 chains to a mound of earth with a mesquite

tree (blazed) bearing S.64° E. distant 1.54 chains. Thence in the same direct^{ion},
w^{ards}, 40 chains to a mound of earth with
a mesquite tree (blazed), bearing S.40° E. dis-
tant 1.59 chains.

Thence in the same direction 40 chains
to a mound of earth with a mesquite
tree (blazed) bearing S.78° E. distant 1 chain.
Thence in the same direction 40 chains
to a large mound of earth standing
upon the south east corner of the observa-
tion. N.10° E. from the mound, is a mesq-
uite tree (blazed) and marked with the
letters I.R. The marked tree is 88 links
distant from the mound.

From thence the line runs South 70° 20' West
40 chains to a mound of earth with a
mesquite tree (blazed), bearing S.70° E.
distant 42 links.

Thence in the same direction 40 chains
to a mound of earth, with a blazed mes-
quite tree bearing S.27° E. distant 20.
links

Thence in the same direction 25 chains
to the river bank where there is a large
mound of rocks with a blazed mes-
quite tree bearing N.31 W. distant 69.
links. This tree is marked with
the letters I.R.

From this corner of the reservation the
boundary line follows the meanderings
of the Creek which are as follows:

The Field notes which precede these remarks pertain to the measurement in Spanish leagues, and the corners of the tract as designated upon the accompanying plot, are marked with letters "A", "B", "C", & "D". The undersigned has added to this tract an amount of

land equal to the difference between your Spanish and four American leagues or 53287 acres, so that either form of measurement can be adopted.

Beginning at the northwest corner of the Spanish league reservation marked "A," upon the plot, the boundary line of this additional tract, runs as follows:

N. $19^{\circ} 40' N.$ 9 chains where it crosses the Clear Fork and continues on in the same bearing for 24.74 chains to a mound of earth on a high prairie.

Hence in the same direction. 40 chains to a mound of earth in a mesquite grove.

Hence in the same direction 28.60 chains to a mound of earth near the California road, with three hackberry trees situated as follows. 1st $N. 87^{\circ} E$ distant, 2.06 chains and marked I.R.
2nd same, 3rd same.

Hence $N. 70^{\circ} 20' E.$ 40 chains to a mound of earth on the prairie with three mesquite trees situated as follows;

1st $0.80^{\circ} N.$ distant 30 links.

2nd $N. 88^{\circ} N.$ " 60 "

3rd, $S. 69^{\circ} E$ " 68 " mm

Hence with the same bearing 40 chains to a mound of earth with a mesquite tree bearing $N. 64^{\circ} E$ distant 40 links.

Hence in the same direction 40 chains

to a mound of earth with a mesquite tree bearing N. by E. distant 27 links
Hence with the same bearing 29 chains where the line crosses a spring brook, and keeps the same course for 11 chains to a mound of earth in the valley, with a Hackberry tree bearing West, distant 2 chains.

Hence with the same bearing 40 chains to a mound of rocks with a mesquite tree bearing S. 68° W. distant 46 links

to be $10^{\circ} 23' 4''$, which has been allowed
in plotting the foregoing survey.
