



A report of the general course of the Pedernales from the mouth of Cypress (a tributary of the Pedernales) to mouth of Pedernales made at the request of Messrs. Collett & Swisher.

Beginning, on East bank of the Pedernales opposite the mouth of Cypress

Thence down said Pedernales with its meanders to wit N 27 1/2 E 650 rods - N 50 3/4 E 320 rods - N 63 E 158 rods - N 50 1/4 E 50 rods - N 62 E 300 rods - N 42 1/2 E 290 rods - N 18 1/4 E 400 rods - left Pedernales on the left

Thence N 31 E leaving Pedernales on the left 2180 rods -

Thence S 59 E 40 rods - leaving Pedernales on the left -

Thence N 37 1/2 E 1000 rods - to Pedernales bluff & crossing a bend in said stream - 2500 rods left said Pedernales on the left

Thence East 1560 rods - to Pedernales bluff & crossing a bend in said stream - 3170 rods - on East bank of Pedernales

Thence N 50 E 400 rods - leaving Pedernales on the left

Thence N 34 1/2 E 1540 rods - leaving Pedernales on the left

Thence N 13 3/4 E 1100 rods - leaving the Pedernales on the left

Thence N 11 E 1860 rods - leaving the Pedernales on the left

Thence N 17 1/4 W 520 rods - to Pedernales bluff

Thence $N 64^{\circ} E 200$ rs - to the mouth
of the Pedernales -
