Opinion No.V-1295

River bed in the area now within the Austin city limits which was not within those limits when House Bill 21, Acts 49th Leg., 1945, was enacted.

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Dear Sir:

You have requested our opinion as to whether the grant by the State to the City of Austin of the bed, banks, and islands of the Colorado River under Acts 49th Leg., 1945, ch.44, p.64, is restricted to the city limits of Austin as they existed upon passage of that Act.

The purpose of the Act as expressed in its caption was to "grant, sell and convey . . . the bed, banks of the Colorado River and the islands in said River, within the present city limits of the City of Austin The body of the Act, after conveying other land, grants "all land in the Colorado River, within the city limits of the City of Austin, including the bed and banks there-of and islands therein." It would seem that the city limits referred to in the body of the Act were meant to be the limits then existing, but whatever doubts could arise in this regard are dispelled by the caption, which clearly shows an intention by the Legislature to grant to the extent of "present" city limits. In our opinion, the legislative grant intended by this Act is restricted to the city limits of Austin as they existed on March 23, 1945, the effective date of the Act in question.

Your letter cites Article 7467a, V.C.S., releasing to cities with populations of 40,000, or more, according to the 1920 census, river beds within their present or future limits. The Supreme Court of Texas has held that this Act applies only to cities with 40,000 or more population according to the 1920 census, and that

the City of Austin, which had a population of less than 40,000 in 1920, acquired no rights to the bed of the Colorado River by reason of the Act. <u>Maufrais</u> <u>v. State</u>, 142 Tex.559, 180 S.W.2d 144 (1944).

### SUMMARY

The grant by the State to the City of Austin of the bed of the Colorado River is restricted to the city limits of Austin as they existed on March 23, 1945, the effective date of Acts 49th Leg., 1945, ch.44, p.64.

SUBJECT: Ownership of Colorado River, Travis County

In accordance with House Bill No. 21, Acts of the Forty-ninth Legislature, 1945, date of passage of said Act being March 23, 1945, the State of Texas issued Patent No. 144, Volume 99A, to the City of Austin, which included the bed of the Colorado River lying within the present (as of the date of the passage of the Act) city limits of Austin. According to Attorney General's Opinion No. V-1295, the City of Austin owns the bed of the Colorado River within the city limits of Austin as those limits existed on March 23, 1945.

The map filed with this memo, entitled "City of Austin Texas and Suburban Territory, August, 1937", indicates the boundaries of the Austin city limits on several dates. The location of the city limits as shown on this map as of August 5, 1937, and as described in the field note description included in City Ordinance on file in the Austin City Clerk's Office, Ordinance Book "K", page 277, (copy filed with this memo), is the same location of the Austin city limits at the time of the passage of H. B. 21, described above.

Gary Glover, Register Professional Land Surveyor, and employee at the City of Austin Public Works Department, Engineering Section, reviewed the city records and found no change in the location of the city limits from the 1937 location until sometime after 1945.

Therefore, the ownership of the bed of the Colorado River located within the City limits of Austin is based on the 1937 city limit location.

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#### AN ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE EXTENSION OF THE CERTAIN BOUNDARY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN AND THE ANNEXATION OF CERTAIN ADDITIONAL TERRI-TORY DESIGNATED AS SECTION "F" OF A CERTAIN BOUNDARY EXTENSION PROGRAM OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN HOLD AND LAUGHNE TO THE DESERT BOUNDARY LIM AND LYING ADJACENT TO THE PRESENT BOUNDARY LIM-ITS OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN IN THE PARTICULARS STATED IN THE ORDINANCE.

GARRY MAURO, Cost BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AUSTIN:

nud - yuly 31 Bouglas SECTION 1. THAT the following described land and territory lying adjacent to the City of Austin be and the same is hereby added and annexed to the City of Austin, and that said territory hereinafter described shall hereafter be included within the boundary limits of the City of Austin, and the present boundary limits of said City, at the various points contiguous to the area hereinafter described, is altered and amended so as to include said area within the corporate limits of the City of Austin, towit:

In the County of Travis, in the State of Texas, which said annexed territory is now designated as Section "F" of a certain boundary extension program of the City of Austin, and being more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at a point where the south line of Manor Road intersects the east right-of-way line of the Llano Branch of the Southern Pacific Railroad;

Thence following the meandering east right-of-way line of said Southern Pacific Railroad in a southerly direction to a concrete monument on the north line of East 19th Street;

Thence following the north line of East 19th Street N. 80044 E. 937.73 feet to a concrete monument;

Thence crossing said East 19th Street and following the east line of a public lane 30 feet in width, S: 9°10' E. 2292.23 feet to a concrete monument in the south line of East 12th Street, the same being a point in the north line of a 33.6 acre tract of land owned by John McClain, and from which concrete mon-ument an elm tree 5 inches in diameter with blaze mark on same bears N.0056' W. 59.35 feet;

Thence crossing said McClain tract S. 6032' W. 1142.73 feet to a point approximately 150 feet north of the north line of Rosewood Avenue near its intersection with Webberville Road;

Thence following a line approximately 150 feet north of and parallel to the north line of Rosewood Avenue, or Webberville Road, N. 78°35' E. 273.77 feet to a point;

Thence crossing said Rosewood Avenue and following a line 150 feet east of and parallel to the east line of Webberville Road S. 27°58' W. 2075.65 feet to a point 150 feet north of the north line of a public road in Govalle;

Thence following a line 150 feet north of the north line of said public road S. 67013' E. 930.01 feet to point of angle;

Thence continuing 150 feet north of and parallel to the north line of said public road, S. 66056' E. 2515.21 feet to a point 150 feet east of the east line of another public road in Govalle;

Thence following a line 150 feet east of the east line of said public road, 5. 30°13' E. 6069.43 feet to a point on the south bank of the Colorado River;

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Thence following the south bank of the Colorado River, S. 55°51' W. 2947.85 feet to a concrete monument and which concrete monument is a corner on the corporate boundary of the City of Austin as amended by election November 24, 1928, and from which concrete monument the top of a water tower at a cotton compress bears N. 11°31' E. and the water tower at the Texas Deaf and Dumb Institute bears N. 54009' W. and the remains of an old dam bears N. 24041'

Thence in a general northerly direction following the meandering corporate boundary of the City of Austin as recognized June 24, 1937, to a point in the south line of Manor Road;

Thence following the south line of Manor Road in an easterly direction to the point of beginning.

SECTION 2. THAT the above described additional territory and area so annexed shall be a part of the City of Austin, and the property so added therein shall bear its pro rata part of the taxes levied by the City of Austin, and the inhabitants thereof shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges of all of the citizens and shall be bound by the acts, ordinances, resolutions and regulations of the City of Austin.

SECTION 3. THAT this ordinance shall be published and passed in the manner provided in Article 1, Section 2a, of the Charter of the City of Austin.

system, including such dam and the reservoir formed thereby and any other property desirable in the operation of the property so leased; provided, however, that the City shall not have power to lease the present steam generating plant of the City and any additions, the present electric distribution system for the distribution of electric current in the City of Austin, and any extensions thereof, and any transmission lines connecting said generating plant and said distribution system, and the City shall not have power to lease its water purification plant and distribution system.

#### CORPORATE BOUNDARIES.

SEC. 2. The boundaries of the City of Austin shall be as follows:

As amended by election November 24, 1928

Beginning at the southwest corner of Outlot 64, Division D" of the City of Austin Government Tracts of the State "O" of Texas at an iron stake set at the low water line of the Colorado River; thence crossing the Colorado River S 23° 32' W 658.05 feet to an iron stake set on the upper bank of the south or southeast side of the Colorado River, said stake being on property now owned by W. D. Hart, and being located on the Santiago Del Valle Survey in Travis County. C. Gaines: thence N 60° 25' W 1543.9 feet to an iron stake close to a fence corner on the east or southeast line of Travis Heights Addition, said stake being the most northerly corner of the Yarrington and Thaxton 40-acre tract out of the Santiago Del Valle Survey; thence with the east line of Travis Heights Addition S 28° 28' W 1186.4 feet to an iron stake, which stake is opposite the south property line of Woodlawn Avenue; thence with the east line of Travis Heights Addition S 28° 15' W 801.0 feet to an iron stake; thence with the fence and the east line of Travis Heights Addition S 31" 52' W 1009.2 feet to an iron stake; thence with the east line of Travis Heights Addition S 30° 22' W 676.96 feet to the southeast corner of Travis Heights Addition; thence crossing the Burleson Road S 31° 9' W 62.3 feet to an iron stake, which is the most northerly corner of property owned by O. P. Hill League in Travis County, and from which stake a live oak tree 9 inches in diameter marked X bears N 41° W 19.17 feet and a live oak tree 6 inches in diameter marked X bears N 21 w 19.17 feet and a live oak tree 6 inches in diameter marked X bears N 29° 40' E 13.05 feet; thence S 84° 45' E 655.94 feet to an iron stake; thence N 85° 21' E 288.89 feet to an iron stake; thence N 89° 0' E 861.20 feet to an iron stake; thence N 86° 27' E 552.98 feet to an iron stake: thence N 86° 10' E 640.12 feet to an iron

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stake; thence N 65° 25' E 1658.15 feet to an iron stake, from which a hackberry tree 6 inches in diameter bears N 10° E 11.3 feet and a gum elastic tree 12 inches in diameter bears S 59° 20' E 52.3 feet; thence N 63° 53' W 1359.8 feet to an iron stake which is the location of the original north corner of the 131.5-acre tract of land out of the William Barton La-bor Survey formerly owned by C. D.
