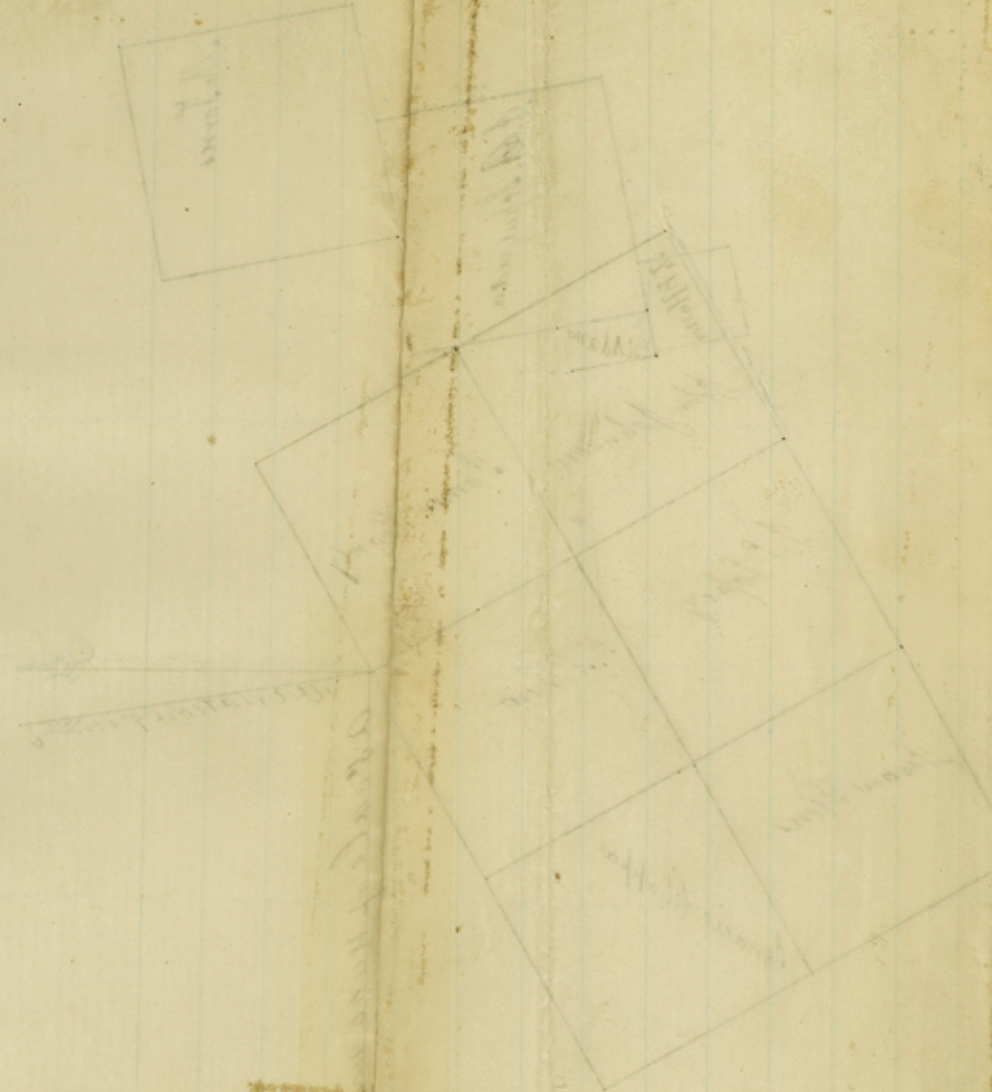

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A careful examination of the adjoining Sketch in regard to a League Survey in the name of John Johnson in Trinity County, filed in Office Febr. 11/59 results, that said survey, according to its Field notes, begins very indefinitely at a Red Oak on the "Land" of James Hanley, but apparently on its North West boundary line, because it runs thence $N. 60^{\circ} W$, $N. 30^{\circ} E$, $S. 60^{\circ} W$ & $S. 30^{\circ} W$ to the beginning, & therefore it cannot lie on that place, where it is represented on the Sketch, besides no Bearing trees agree with those of the adjacent surveys. The Title of John Johnson although dated Oct. 6/35, is not signed by the Commissioner.
