By comparing all the original field notes, and reading same carefully you will see that the wording description survey will comply with sec 2. You will also note that the distance from the N.E. corner of Sec 24 to the N.E. corner of Sec 24 is 1686.75' and it should be only 1490.25' but in what the field notes call for, is what is on the ground. At 1490.25' the county map shows that there should be a vacant strip of land between said strip and the water, and in fact there is, but not near so much as the map shows. But the work on the ground as of today shows that the distance from line of Sec 24 to the north boundary of Sec 24 is 1686.75'.

I hope that this will give you an idea how the land is. You must take into consideration that when this work was first made it was in the interest of the people. The people's interest and of course it was to show that parties interested at that time that these surveys were made had to have the timber on the land, that was a great deal of timber and in fact the timber was being caught up with. Hoping this will help to unclutter the business.

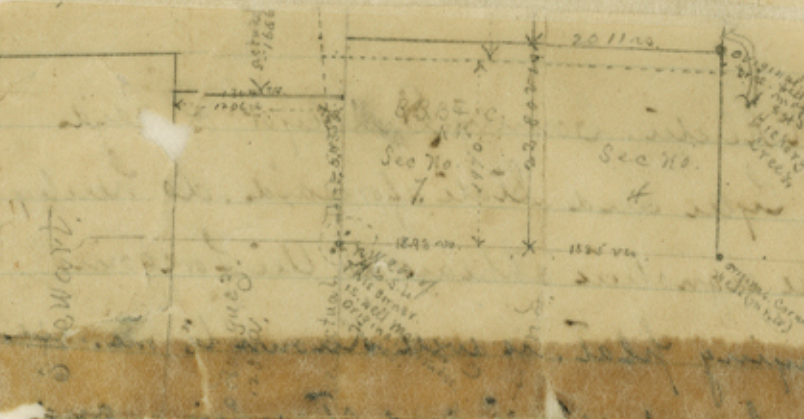
