SURVEYORS STATEMENT IN CONNECTION WITH THE RE-TRACEMENT OF SURVEYS IN THE VICINITY OF THE LEWIS THUNAR SURVEY, A-636, TYLER COUNTY, TEXAS

A search of the General Land Office Records reveals that the following listed men laid down surveys in the vicinity of the Lewis Thunar Survey;

I identified the original southeast corner of the Lewis Thunar Survey and the original southeast corner of the E. Jewell 480 acre Survey by pine stump holes of original bearing trees as called for by E. Jewell. From remains of bearing trees and stump holes I identified three (3) original northwest corners of the Nancy Skillern Survey and the original northeast corner of G. & B. N. Section 7, Block 4 as laid down by M. L. McAlister.

The G. & B. N. Section 7, Block 4 was called to adjoin the east line of the Thunar. McAlister built this section off the northeast corner of the Thunar calling for identical witness trees at this corner. However, this section was never patented as such. In more recent years said original section has been subdivided and patented in six parcels on the work of J. C. McBride, T. M. Hyde and E. H. Hopson.

I identified the original northeast and southwest corners of the A. A.

Foster Survey on the ground by its witness trees as called for by T. M. Hyde.

I have located the common north corner of the Thunar and Foster Surveys in a cemetery to be coincident with the position of same as reported to you by T. M. Hyde October 6, 1931.

I have placed the east line and the east portions of the north and south lines of the Thunar Survey to fit those above corners that call to adjoin the Thunar. Without finding the original west corners of the Thunar Survey, after diligent search, I have located the balance of the north and south lines and the west line from six (6) calls for natural objects recited by Jewell in his field notes. The lines thus placed fit the occupied and recognized common north corner of the Thunar and John St. Clair Surveys and the recognized common corner of these surveys and the John T. Bush and John Kerger Surveys. All four surveys were laid down by Jewell at the same time. Thus located the east line of the Thunar is 18.86 varas short of call and the north, west and south lines are 27.10 varas, 5.28 varas and 14.18 varas, respectively, excessive of call. The survey calculated to contain 1288.79 acres of land, or 8.79 acres in excess of call.

I identified on the ground from bearing trees or their remains the original south corners of the John Seip and G. C. Blackburn Surveys as laid down by John McBride.

I identified on the ground by the bearing trees and stumps the original southeast and northwest corners of the Wesley Horn Survey. I placed the southwest corner at its occupied and recognized corner, which is close to called distance from its southeast and northwest corners. The east line of the Horn and the east line of the Foster Surveys have been made continuous between two original corners by T. M. Hyde.

The original southeast corner of the Ed Yancy was identified on the ground by the marked stumps of its original bearing trees. J. C. McBride called to

General Land Office 6/27/55 begin this survey at the southwest corner of the G. & B. N. Section 7. After a diligent search I failed to find either of the west corners or the northeast corner of the Yancy. I have honored the Yancy's adjoinder calls and placed the west and south lines along the west and south lines of G. & B. N. Section 7 (the east line of the Thunar and the north line of the Skillern). The east and north lines have been fitted to survey corners and fall along occupied and recognized lines. Located in this manner the south, east and north lines are 24.25 varas, 10.07 varas and 11.33 varas, respectively, excessive and the west line is 2.72 varas short of call. As located the Yancy calculates to contain 82.06 acres, or 2.06 acres in excess of call. I am submitting for your approval corrected field notes for the Lewis Thunar Survey, Abstract 636 and the Ed Yancy Survey, Abstract 1003, for use in issuing Deeds of Acquittance.
